COURT HEARINGS

For any Court proceedings, **upon arrival at our office, you will need to call 830-249-2820 to let us know you are here.** You will receive a call back from the clerk when the Court is ready to hear your case. The Bailiff will ask you health questions and take your temperature at the front door. Parties are encouraged, but not required, to wear a face covering while in the courtroom.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and in conjunction with the Supreme Court's ruling, any party may request that they appear before the Court telephonically or by Zoom. This request must be made in writing no later than 5 days prior to court. Any person considered to be in the "Vulnerable Population" or "Highly Vulnerable Population" can make this request.

Individuals age 65 to 72, who have no serious underlying health conditions such as high blood pressure, chronic lung disease, decreased lung capacity, diabetes, obesity, asthma, compromised immune systems (including by chemotherapy for cancer or other conditions requiring such therapy), or are receiving oxygen therapy, are considered to be Vulnerable Populations.

Individuals age 73 and over, and individuals of any age who have serious underlying health conditions, such as high blood pressure, chronic lung disease, decreased lung capacity, diabetes, obesity, asthma, compromised immune systems (including by chemotherapy for cancer or other conditions requiring such therapy), or are receiving oxygen therapy, are considered to be Highly Vulnerable Populations.

IF YOU REQUEST TO APPEAR TELEPHONICALLY OR BY ZOOM, ANY EVIDENCE YOU INTEND TO PRESENT MUST BE E-MAILED TO judge3@co.kendall.tx.us 3 DAYS PRIOR TO THE HEARING.

MOTIONS FOR CONTINUANCE SHOULD BE FILED BY EMAIL NO LATER THAN FRIDAY OF THE WEEK PRECEDING TRIAL AND MUST BE IN WRITING, SERVED ON THE OPPOSING PARTY, AND MAY BE GRANTED OR DENIED AT THE DISCRETION OF THE COURT.

YOUR FAILURE TO CALL THE COURT AND APPEAR FOR TRIAL MAY RESULT IN A JUDGMENT AGAINST YOU AND/OR DISMISSAL OF YOUR CLAIM.
