KENDALL COUNTY RESOLUTION 2022-0926 SUPPORTING EFFORTS TO PRESERVE NIGHT SKIES

WHEREAS, Kendall County residents recognize the importance of our Texas Hill Country for its diverse ecosystems, ethics for land stewardship, rich cultural heritage, and scenic beauty; and

WHEREAS, an influx of people, and accompanying light trespass from outdoor lighting fixtures and billboards have impacted our natural environment and our quality of life, reducing our night sky visibility and enjoyment; and

WHEREAS, in recent years greater focus has been placed on preserving our county's scenic beauty; maintaining its unique historic heritage and enhancing tourism; and preserving our starry night skies to remain unique among other fast-growing Texas Counties; and

WHEREAS, preserving dark nighttime skies in our region is vital to the United States military, which conducts extensive nighttime training at sites proximal to our County, requiring a degree of darkness for these training activities to be possible; and

WHEREAS, Kendall County is committed to supporting practices throughout the County that limit or minimize light trespass, glare, and skyglow from outdoor lighting in order to protect the beauty of the night skies and allow others the full benefit and use of their property; and

WHEREAS, outdoor lighting fixtures are readily available that are designed to direct light only where it is needed, distribute light more efficiently and effectively, and thereby reduce glare, power consumption and cost; and

WHEREAS, best practices are well documented by International Dark Sky Association to include fully-shielded fixtures; downward facing lights; using LED's of 2700 degrees Kelvin or less; using no more light than is needed; using switches and motion sensors; and

WHEREAS, Kendall County Friends of the Night Sky, and Texas Hill Country Alliance promote October as Hill Country Night Sky Month, an annual celebration of our region's most dazzling night-time feature – star-twinkling, planet-glowing, comet-crossing night sky – where beauty and wonder abound; and

WHEREAS, Hill Country Alliance, in acknowledgement of our October Full Moon, has declared Sunday, October 9th as a Celebration of The Hill Country Night Sky, and encourages all citizens to join in a Kendall County Backyard Howl At The Moon.

NOW, THEREFORE, by action of our Kendall County Commissioners Court at a duly noticed and held public meeting and as reflected in the minutes of the Court, be it resolved that Kendall County designates Sunday October 9th as "Backyard Howl At The Moon Night."

COUNTY PREPARES COMMUNITY WILDFIRE PROTECTION PLAN

(Boerne, TX) - So far this year, nearly 600,000 acres have burned across the state of Texas-close to double the number of acres burned in 2021. With the extreme drought conditions and unending 100+ degree days, more acres are certain to burn.

As Kendall County fire departments continue to respond to record numbers of fires,
County Fire Chiefs have come together with partners to prepare the county's first Community
Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP). A CWPP is a proven strategy for reducing the risk of catastrophic
wildfires and protecting lives and property.

When a wildfire happens, fire departments respond to protect life and property. Before the wildfire occurs, homeowners have a distinct responsibility to prepare their homes to survive a wildfire. Life and safety are the priority when a wildfire happens. No home, regardless of its monetary value, is worth more than the life of another person.

With the extended drought conditions, Kendall County has been one of 224 counties across the state of Texas that have had burn bans in place throughout the summer. No outdoor burning is to occur when a burn ban is in place, and each resident should be extra careful and take precautions to avoid unintended fires, such as parking your off-road vehicle over dried vegetation or using equipment without spark arrestors. Never discard any previously lit material, such as cigarettes, cigars or charcoal on the side of the road. Ninety percent of all wildfires are caused by humans. Do not be the cause of the next tragedy.

If you see smoke, report it immediately by calling 9-1-1. The sooner a fire is reported, the sooner the local fire department can respond, providing the best chance to limit the spread.

Several community workshops will be held to review the CWPP Core Team's progress, share information so that residents better understand their responsibilities to prepare for and prevent wildfires, and to gain feedback from others.
