WHEREAS, Americans are the victims of more than 20 million crimes each year, affecting individuals and communities; and

WHEREAS, providing victims with knowledge of their rights and available services further strengthens their ability to recover by restoring a sense of self-empowerment; and

WHEREAS, victims who feel understood and supported are more likely to disclose their victimization, seek services, and participate in the justice process; and

WHEREAS, a multi-disciplinary response, involving collaboration among victim service professionals, criminal justice officials, legal professionals, medical and mental health providers, and community leaders is essential to reach and serve all victims—especially those who are marginalized, have disabilities, or live in remote locations; and

WHEREAS, National Crime Victims' Rights Week, April 8-14, 2018, provides an opportunity to recommit to ensuring that all victims of crime—especially those who are challenging to reach or serve—are afforded their rights and receive a trauma-informed response; and

WHEREAS, March 3, 2018 was the 8th Annual Heal the Soul 5k/10k Trail Run benefiting the Kendall County Women's Shelter (KCWS) and Kendall County by providing funding to provide a safe haven for victims of violence; and

WHEREAS, Kendall County is hereby dedicated to strengthening victims and survivors in the aftermath of crime, building resilience in our communities and our victim responders, and working for justice for all victims and survivors;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Darrel Lux, as County Judge of Kendall County, do hereby proclaim the week of April 8-14, 2018, as

Crime Victims' Rights Week

Proclamation: April is Child Abuse Prevention Month

WHEREAS, In America every 11 seconds a child is abused or neglected. The number of *Texas* children reported as confirmed victims of abuse or neglect reached an astounding high of more than <u>60,000</u> for 2017. A more devastating statistic is the fact that <u>171 Texas</u> children lost their lives as a result of abuse and neglect in 2017. Sadly, the parents of these children continue to be the main perpetrators of the abuse and/or neglect; and

WHEREAS, Kendall County saw a <u>6%</u> increase of <u>39</u>, confirmed cases of child abuse and/or neglect in 2017, and fortunately there were <u>ZERO</u> abuse/neglect fatalities for Kendall County for 2017. As cited by the Texas Department of Protective & Regulatory Services. These numbers do not account for the victims who are abused by an acquaintance, family friend, neighbor, minister, or Coach. Many instance go unreported; and

WHEREAS, Kendall County must make every effort to promote prevention program and awareness. It is with collaborated partnerships among agencies, schools, religious organizations, law enforcement, district attorneys, counselors, victim advocates, and the business community as a while that these prevention measures are successful where children can grow and succeed in a safe, stable, and nurturing environment that is free from abuse and/or neglect. And, any person who has "cause to believe" or suspicion that "abuse has occurred or will occur", must report according to Texas State Law.

We all must STAND UP TO CHILD ABUSE.

THEREFORE, I, DARREL L. LUX, **HONORABLE KENDALL COUNTY JUDGE**, **do hereby proclaim the month of April 2018 be recognized as** *Child Abuse* **Prevention Month in Kendall county.** We, as a community, must get involved in prevention efforts against this unspeakable crime before it ever occurs. After all, it is up to us to protect our children and their voice.

SECOND AMENDED AND RESTATED FINANCIAL GUARANTEE CASH DEPOSIT AGREEMENT

This Financial Guarantee Cash Deposit Agreement (this "Agreement") is entered into between Anthony Palumbo, Karl Gramling d/b/a Gramling Real Estate Holdings LLC (hereinafter "Palumbo and Gramling"), and Kendall County (hereinafter "County"), a subdivision of the State of Texas.

WHEREAS, Palumbo and Gramling, deposited cash in the amount indicated herein with the County on March 30, 2017 as the financial guarantee pursuant to Section 205.1300, *Kendall County, Texas Development Rules and Regulations* for satisfactory and timely completion of the following to be constructed at the Pleasant Valley Business Park (hereinafter the "Subdivision"):

- (1) Street and drainage improvements in the Subdivision; and
- (2) Construction of a Detention Pond in the Subdivision; and
- (3) Provision of a Public Water System for the Subdivision.

WHEREAS, Palumbo and Gramling, deposited cash with the County, in the following amounts:

- (1) Two hundred twenty one thousand, four hundred forty three and no/100 dollars (\$221,443.00) as the financial guarantee for the Street and Drainage improvements; and
- (2) Thirty three thousand, eight hundred forty and no/100 dollars (\$33,840.00) as financial guarantee for construction of the Detention Pond; and
- (3) Fifty seven thousand, seven hundred sixty two and no/100 dollars (\$57,762.00) for provision of the Public Water System; and

WHEREAS, Palumbo and Gramling have submitted a final plat for the Subdivision,

WHEREAS, Palumbo and Gramling has caused the completion of Street and Drainage improvements and the County authorized release of \$221,433.00 being held by the County under the Original Surety to Palumbo and Gramling, and Palumbo and Gramling have received such payment from the County; and

WHEREAS, Palumbo and Gramling has caused the completion of Detention Pond improvements and the County authorized release of \$33,840.00 being held by the County under the Original Surety to Palumbo and Gramling, and Palumbo and Gramling have received such payment from the County; and

WHEREAS, Palumbo and Gramling has caused the partial completion of Public Water System improvements and the County authorized release of \$22,762.00 being held by the County under the Original Surety to Palumbo and Gramling, and Palumbo and Gramling have received such payment from the County; and

NOW THEREFORE, in recognition of the consideration provided herein, the County and Palumbo and Gramling agree as follows:

- 1. The County Treasurer shall hold the cash deposit in an interest bearing account, with any interest accruing to such funds to be retained in the account for the benefit of the County, until such time as the Street and Drainage improvements, the Detention Pond, and the Public Water System are completed by Palumbo and Gramling in accordance with the final plat and construction drawings and specifications approved by the County or until such funds are forfeited to the County as set out herein:
 - a) Thirty Five Thousand and no/100 dollars (\$35,000.00) for the Public Water System.
- 2. Palumbo and Gramling acknowledge and agree that, in the event that the Street and Drainage Improvements, the construction of the Detention Pond, and the provision of the Public Water System are not completed on or prior to July 31, 2018 in accordance with the final plat and construction drawings and specifications approved by the County, the applicable amount of the funds on deposit will be forfeited to the County to use to complete either the Street and Drainage Improvements, the Detention Pond, and/or the Public Water System as applicable.

FOURTH AMENDED AND RESTATED CASHIERS CHECKS DEPOSIT AGREEMENT

This Amended and Restated Cashier's Checks Deposit Agreement (this "Agreement") is entered into between Miralomas Development Corporation, a Delaware corporation ("Miralomas"), and Kendall County (the "County"), a subdivision of the State of Texas.

WHEREAS, Steve Petuck, acting as President of LH Devco, Inc., executed that certain Cashier's Checks Deposit Agreement (herein after, the "Original Surety") with the County on June 30, 2014 related to the approved plat for Lerin Hills Garden Homes Subdivision, Unit 1, Phase 1 (the "Subdivision") to serve as a financial guarantee pursuant to Section 205.1300, Kendall County, Texas Development Rules and Regulations for satisfactory and timely completion of the following:

- (1) Texas Department of Transportation approved work on State Highway 46 to provide access to the Subdivision (the "TxDOT Work");
- (2) Street improvements in the Subdivision (the "Street Improvements"); and
- (3) Drainage improvements in the Subdivision (the "Drainage Improvements"); and

WHEREAS, LH Devco, Inc., pursuant to the Original Surety, deposited cashier's checks with the County, in the following amounts:

- (1) Three hundred three thousand, three hundred twenty five and no/100 dollars (\$303,325.00) as surety for the TxDOT Work; and
- (2) Nine hundred thirteen thousand, two hundred sixty three and no/100 dollars (\$913,263.00) for the Street Improvements;
- (3) Two hundred sixty one thousand, fifty two and no/100 dollars (\$261,052.00) for the Drainage Improvements; and

WHEREAS, the assets of LH Devco, Inc. including the Subdivision have been acquired by Miralomas as the designee of Putnam Bridge Funding III, LLC following that certain Order Confirming First Amended Joint Plan of Liquidation of MA Lerin Hills Holder, LP et al., United States Bankruptcy Court of the Western

District of Texas, San Antonio division (CASE NO. 15-51424), September 10, 2015, and

WHEREAS, Charles E. Cook, acting as Authorized Officer of Miralomas, executed that certain Amended and Restated Cashier's Checks Deposit Agreement (herein after, the "First Amended Surety Agreement") with the County on September 26, 2016 related to the approved plat for Lerin Hills Garden Homes Subdivision, Unit 1, Phase 1 (the "Subdivision") to serve as a financial guarantee pursuant to Section 205.1300, Kendall County, Texas Development Rules and Regulations.

WHEREAS, Miralomas has caused the completion of TxDOT Work and the County has authorized the release of \$303,325.00 being held by the County under the Original Surety to Miralomas, and Miralomas has received such payment from the County; and

WHEREAS, Miralomas is proceeding with final Street Improvements and Drainage Improvements on behalf of Miralomas, in accordance with their contract, and anticipate the completion of those requirements by October, 2017.

WHEREAS, Miralomas has requested an extension until December 31, 2017, of the deadline stated in the First Amended Surety Agreement to allow Miralomas to complete the Street Improvements and Drainage Improvements.

NOW THEREFORE, in recognition of the consideration provided herein, the County and Miralomas agree as follows:

- 1. This "Second Amended and Restated Cashier's Check Agreement" shall amend and restate in its entirety the Original Surety and Amended and Restated Cashier's Check Agreement upon execution by both parties.
- 2. The County Treasurer shall hold the following cashier check deposits in an interest bearing account, with any interest accruing to such funds to be retained in the account for the benefit of the County, until such time as the infrastructure improvements are completed by Miralomas in accordance with the amended final plat and revised construction drawings and specifications approved by the County or until such funds are forfeited to the County as set out herein:
 - a) Nine hundred thirteen thousand, two hundred sixty three and no/100 dollars
 (\$913,263.00) for the Street Improvements;
 - b) Two hundred sixty-one thousand, fifty-two and no/100 dollars (\$261,052.00) for the Drainage Improvements; and

3. Miralomas acknowledges and agrees that, in the event that the infrastructure improvements are not completed on or prior to July 31, 2018, in accordance with the amended final plat and revised construction drawings and specifications approved by the County, the applicable amount of the funds on deposit will be forfeited to the County to use to complete either the infrastructure improvements, as applicable.
