If the area incorporates, the municipality will be responsible for provision of such services. Those citizens supporting incorporation are asking the Commissioners Court to continue provision of some services to the area in the event of incorporation to allow the resulting municipality time to get organized and financially able to provide all services currently provided by Kendall County.

KENDALL COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. 05-11-2015 RESOLUTION CONCERNING THE PROPOSED INCORPORATION OF COMFORT

WHEREAS, interested citizens in Comfort have investigated methods by which self rule may be instituted in that area and have determined that the most viable alternative is the incorporation of Comfort; and

WHEREAS, a presentation has been made to the Commissioners Court addressing the advantages of incorporation, both to citizens residing in the proposed area to be incorporated and to all residents of Kendall County; and

WHEREAS, the majority of the area of Comfort is located in the unincorporated area of Kendall County with a smaller area of Comfort located in the unincorporated area of Kerr County; and

WHEREAS, Kendall County is responsible for providing services to the area of Comfort located in Kendall County and Kerr County is responsible for providing services to the area of Comfort located in Kerr County; and

WHEREAS, as an incorporated municipality, Comfort would have the responsibility for provision of services to the area within the municipal limits, thereby relieving Kendall County and Kerr County of such responsibility; and

WHEREAS, there are certain legal requirements, including the conduct of an election, before an area can become incorporated under applicable law; and

WHEREAS, it is not the intent of the Commissioners Court to influence the citizens residing within the area to be considered for incorporation deciding whether or not incorporation should be approved, that being a decision best left to the residents of the area; and

WHEREAS, it is proper for the Commissioners Court to assure the citizens residing within the area proposed to be incorporated that, if the decision is made to incorporate, the Commissioners Court will continue to provide services to the citizens of the area within the incorporated area located in Kendall County as may be allowed under the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas until such time as the resulting municipality is able to assume responsibility for providing such services;

NOW, THEREFORE, the following RESOLUTION is adopted concerning the proposed incorporation of Comfort:

RESOLVED, that in the event the voters within the area proposed to be incorporated as the municipality of Comfort vote favorably for incorporation, Kendall County will, to the extent allowable by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, continue to provide services in the areas of road, bridge and drainage maintenance and law enforcement to the incorporated area located in Kendall County until such time as financial and practical considerations make it feasible for the resulting municipality to provide such services; provided that expenditures for provision of such services must be approved in the annual budget of Kendall County; and provided further that the provision of such services shall not extend beyond ______ years from the effective date of incorporation.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION	The Boerne Soccer League leases the field from the County all year, but has given their permission for the church to use the field during the requested dates since they will not be having soccer games at that time.

LEASE AGREEMENT

PARTIES: The parties to this agreement are the owner of the Property, KENDALL COUNTY (COUNTY) and the lessee of the Property, the TRINITY PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH (PCA) of BOERNE, TEXAS, (TENANT).

PROPERTY: COUNTY leases to TENANT that real property owned by COUNTY which lies east of the Boerne Community Center and south of the Kendall County jail located northeast of the intersection of Adler and Staudt streets, Boerne, Kendall County, Texas, consisting of unimproved real property.

TERM: This lease commences on June 30, 2015 at 6:00 p.m. (Commencement Date) and ends on June 30, 2015 at 8:00 p.m. (Termination Date) unless terminated earlier in accordance with the terms set out herein.

TERMINATION: TENANT understands and agrees that any violation of the terms of this Agreement by TENANT shall result in the immediate termination of the Agreement.

RENT: TENANT will pay COUNTY rent in the amount of One and no/100 dollars (\$1.00).

UTILITIES: TENANT will pay any fees for utilities to the premises required by the conduct of their activities on the premises.

USE AND OCCUPANCY:

- 1. ALLOWABLE USES: TENANT shall use the premises for the following purposes: Soccer games.
- 2. PROHIBITIONS: TENANT may not permit the premises to be used for any activity that is unlawful, offensive, dangerous, or that constitutes a nuisance.

ACCESS BY COUNTY: COUNTY or other persons authorized by COUNTY may enter the property by reasonable means and at reasonable times to inspect the property and for other lawful purposes.

MAINTENANCE AND UPKEEP OF THE PREMISES:

 TENANT'S responsibilities: TENANT shall dispose of all trash, garbage and debris resulting from TENANT'S use of the premises. TENANT shall take precautions to prevent damages to the premises. TENANT shall be responsible for making any repairs resulting from TENANT'S use of the premises. TENANT shall promptly notify COUNTY of any damage to the premises.

2. COUNTY'S responsibilities: TENANT agrees and acknowledges that COUNTY has no responsibility to maintain the premises. TENANT accepts the premises in their present condition.

Our number one resource – water! This basic

course in water works operation introduces the participant to the relationship between safe potable (drinking) water and health, and the important role that the water operator plays in maintaining adequate, safe drinking water supplies. An overall view of the water cycle is presented together with a general description of the responsibilities of water system personnel and the need for regulation of the water utility industry to protect the public health, safety, and welfare. Texas' rules and regulations for licensing of water system operators are included.

Additionally, participants will be introduced to the source, characteristics, production, treatment, disinfection, storage, and distribution of potable water as practiced elaborating on general hazards and safety practices. Basic water chemistry and math skills are developed and applied to chemical feeding and other operational problems through classroom discussion.
