



Hazard Mitigation Plan Public Meeting on May 5, 2016

Kendall County and the City of Boerne will hold a public meeting on Wednesday, May 5th to gather public input for a County-wide Hazard Mitigation Plan. The meeting is from 5:00 to 6:00 p.m. at the Boerne Fire Station, Training Room; 726 North Main Street, Boerne 78006. The public is invited and encouraged to attend the meeting.

The purpose of the public meeting is to provide a project overview from H₂O Partners, Inc., consultant to the project, and solicit information from citizens. Public input will help the project team to identify and analyze potential hazards affecting residents and recommend possible actions to reduce their impact. Hazards included are dam failure, drought, extreme heat, flood, hurricane wind, thunderstorm wind, tornado, wildfire, and winter storm.

The goal of the Hazard Mitigation Plan is to minimize or eliminate the long-term risk to human life and property from known hazards by identifying and implementing cost-effective mitigation actions. Mitigation is defined by the Federal Emergency Management Agency as sustained actions taken to reduce or eliminate long-term risk to people and property from hazards and their effects.
