Proclamation: April is Child Abuse Prevention Month

WHEREAS, In America, every 11 seconds a child is abused or neglected. The number of *Texas* children reported as confirmed victims of abuse or neglect reached an astounding high total of <u>60,138</u> for 2016. A more devastating statistic is the fact that <u>222</u> *Texas* children lost their lives as a result of abuse or neglect in 2016. Sadly, the parents of these children continue to be the main perpetrators of the abuse and/or neglect.

WHEREAS, In Kendall County, there were <u>32</u> confirmed cases of child abuse and/or neglect in 2016, and fortunately there were <u>ZERO</u> abuse/neglect fatalities for Kendall County for 2016 as cited by the Texas State Department of Protective & Regulatory Services. These numbers do not account for the victims who are abused by an acquaintance, family friend, neighbor, minister, or coach. Many instances go unreported.

WHEREAS, Kendall County must make every effort to promote prevention programs and awareness. It is with collaborated partnerships among agencies, schools, religious organizations, law enforcement, district attorneys, counselors, victim advocates, and the business community as a whole that these prevention measures are successful where children can grow and succeed in a safe, stable, and nurturing environment that is free from abuse and/or neglect. And, any person who has "cause to believe" or suspicion that "abuse has occurred or **will** occur", must report according to Texas State Law.

We all must STAND UP TO CHILD ABUSE.

THEREFORE, I, Darrel L. Lux, Honorable Kendall County Judge, do hereby proclaim the month of April, 2017 be recognized as *Child Abuse Prevention Month* in Kendall County. We, as a community, must get involved in prevention efforts against this unspeakable crime before it even occurs. After all, it is up to us to protect our children and be their voice.

The Court Order

The Court adopted the Kendall County Fire Code on September 28, 2015. The Order states the purpose of the "Fire Code is to provide minimum requirements . . . for the design and construction or substantial improvement of public buildings, commercial establishments, and multi-family dwellings with four or more units to reduce risk to life and property from fire;"

The Court Order also states that "upon adoption of the Fire Code, the Kendall County Fire Marshal's office shall inspect a building subject to 233.064(a)¹ of the Texas Local Government Code to determine whether the building complies with the County Fire Code."

The Court Order further states that the Fire Code "shall be effective January 1, 2016, . . . and shall apply to all buildings upon which construction or substantial improvement begins after that date."

The Code

The Code itself, states in Section 1.3 – Purpose, "Fire safety in regard to operations and use of building and structures after construction, whether or not their construction was subject to this Code, shall be enforced independent of this Code by the County Fire Marshall in accordance with applicable law, including but not limited to his independent authority to inspect for the presence of fire and life safety hazards and order their correction under Chapter 352 of the Texas Local Government Code."

Section 1.7 states, the Kendall County Fire Code shall consist of this Code plus the International Fire Code 2015 Edition, and all of its references, . . . "

Section 2.12 states that Substantial Improvement means "The repair, restoration, reconstruction, improvement, or remodeling of a public building, a commercial establishment, or a multi-family dwelling for which the cost exceeds 50% of the building's value according to the certified tax appraisal roll for the county for the year preceding the year in which the work was begun, or a change in the occupancy classification involving a change in the purpose or level of activity in a building, including the renovation of a warehouse into a loft apartment."

Section 8.3 – Fees states that "The County shall deposit all fees received under this section in a special fund in the County Treasury, . . . and money in the Treasury shall be used only for the administration and enforcement of the . . . Code."

Background and Commentary

The Fire Code has been in place for a little more than year now. I am requesting that the Fire Marshal and/or his Deputy report to the Court regarding the implementation of the Code to determine if

¹ The relevance of this citation is questionable. It reads, "The county shall inspect a building subject to this subchapter to determine whether the building complies with the fire code." It does not describe which buildings are to be inspected. The citation is likely a typographical error that should read Section 233.062(a), which describes the buildings that are subject to the code as public buildings, commercial establishments, and multifamily dwellings with four or more units.

adjustments might be warranted to the code and/or the way it is administered and enforced. I have experienced a considerable amount of interest, feedback, and questions from Precinct 4 business owners regarding the Code and how it is being applied and enforced. Several have requested a town hall meeting, but I would prefer to handle this in the Open Session of a Commissioners Court meeting. Some of the information I would like to see covered in the Fire Marshal's report includes:

- 1. How many buildings were inspected in 2016, and in which precincts are they located?
- 2. Summarize the results of those inspections for 2016.
 - a. How many inspections were for <u>existing</u> buildings, the operation, construction, or substantial improvement of which started prior to 2016?
 - i. How many passed on the initial inspection?
 - ii. How many serious threats to the public health, safety and welfare were identified?
 - iii. How many violations of the Code were identified?
 - iv. How many Building Owners voluntarily remedied the Fire Code violations?
 - b. How many inspections were performed on <u>new</u> buildings or buildings that began substantial alteration after January 1, 2016.
 - i. How many violations were identified?
 - ii. How many were successfully addressed or otherwise resolved?
 - c. How many Certificates of Compliance were issued and filed in 2016?
 - d. How many Certificates of Non-compliance were issued and filed in 2016?

3. Plans and Permits

- a. How many sets of plans for construction or substantial alteration were submitted for review in 2016?
- b. How many permits for construction or substantial alteration were issued in 2016?
- c. Are you aware of any projects that were scrapped or discontinued during 2016 due to Fire Code related requirements?

4. Fire Code Fund

- a. What was the total of the receipts taken in for permits and inspections in 2016?
- b. What expenditures were made out of the Fire Code Fund
- c. What is the balance in the Fire Code Fund?

5. Variances

- a. Who are the members of the Board of Appeals?
- b. How many variances were requested of the Board of Appeals in 2016?
- c. How many variances were granted by the Board of Appeals in 2016?
- d. How many appeals to Commissioners Court of the Board of Appeals decisions were made in 2016?
- e. How many Board of Appeals decisions were affirmed or reversed by the Commissioners Court in 2016?

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to the creation of the Heart of Texas Aquifer District and the dissolution of certain groundwater conservation districts; providing authority to issue bonds; providing authority to impose assessments, fees, or surcharges.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

ARTICLE 1. CREATION OF DISTRICT

SECTION 1.1. CREATION OF DISTRICT. Subtitle H, Title 6, Special District Local Laws Code, is amended by adding Chapter 8892 to read as follows:

CHAPTER 8892. HEART OF TEXAS AQUIFER DISTRICT
SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Sec. 8892.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

(1) "Board" means the board of directors of the

<u>district.</u>

(2) "Director" means a member of the board.

(3) "District" means the Heart of Texas Aquifer

<u>District.</u>

Sec. 8892.002. NATURE OF DISTRICT. The district is a groundwater conservation district in Comal County created under and essential to accomplish the purposes of Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution.

Sec. 8892.003. INITIAL DISTRICT TERRITORY. The initial territory of the district:

(1) consists of the territory of the following counties except as provided by Subdivision (2):

(A) Blanco;

(B) Burnet;

(C) Comal;

(D) Hays; and

(E) Kendall; and

(2) does not include territory included inside the territorial boundaries of the following districts as those boundaries are established on September 1, 2017:

(A) the Barton Springs-Edwards Aquifer

Conservation District;

(B) the Edwards Aquifer Authority; or

(C) the Plum Creek Conservation District.

SUBCHAPTER B. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Sec. 8892.051. COMPOSITION OF BOARD. The district is governed by a board of five appointed directors.

Sec. 8892.052. TERMS AND APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTORS.

Directors serve staggered four-year terms. Directors are appointed as follows:

(1) one director appointed by the Blanco County Commissioners Court:

(2) one director appointed by the Burnet County Commissioners Court;

(3) one director appointed by the Comal County Commissioners Court:

. (4) one director appointed by the Hays County Commissioners Court; and

(5) one director appointed by the Kendall County Commissioners Court.

Sec. 8892.053. VACANCIES. If there is a vacancy on the board, the commissioners court of the county that appointed the director whose position has become vacant shall appoint a person to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the term.

SUBCHAPTER C. POWERS AND DUTIES

Sec. 8892.101. GROUNDWATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT POWERS
AND DUTIES. The district has the rights, powers, privileges,
functions, and duties provided by the general law of this state,
including Chapter 36, Water Code, applicable to groundwater
conservation districts created under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas
Constitution.

Sec. 8892.102. CONTRACTS. The district may contract with a state agency or political subdivision, including a municipality, a county, a river authority, or another district, to carry out any function of the district.

SECTION 1.2. APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTORS. Not later than September 1, 2018, the county commissioners courts of Blanco, Burnet, Comal, Hays, and Kendall Counties each shall appoint a member of the board of directors of the Heart of Texas Aquifer District as required by Section 8892.052, Special District Local Laws Code, as added by this Act.

ARTICLE 2. TRANSFERS; DISSOLUTION OF DISTRICTS; REPEALER SECTION 2.1. DEFINITIONS. In this article:

- $\mbox{(1)}$ "Aquifer district" means the Heart of Texas Aquifer District.
 - (2) "Districts" means the following:
- (A) the Blanco-Pedernales Groundwater Conservation District;
 - (B) the Central Texas Groundwater Conservation

District;

(C) the Comal Trinity Groundwater Conservation

District;

District.

(D) the Cow Creek Groundwater Conservation

District; and

- (E) the Hays Trinity Groundwater Conservation
- SECTION 2.2. TRANSFERS. (a) Not earlier than September 1, 2018, and not later than December 1, 2018, each of the districts shall:
- (1) transfer the district's assets, debts, and contractual rights and obligations to the aquifer district; and
- (2) provide notice and make recordings of the transfers under this section as required by the Water Code, Property Code, and other law.
- (b) On December 1, 2018, the powers, functions, and duties of the districts are transferred to the aquifer district.

SECTION 2.3. PROHIBITION ON CERTAIN ACTIONS. (a) Before December 1, 2018, the board of directors of the aquifer district:

- (1) may not take any regulatory action under Chapter
 36, Water Code;
- (2) shall adopt rules for the administration of the aquifer district under Chapter 36, Water Code; and
 - (3) may hire employees of the aquifer district.
- (b) On and after December 1, 2018, the districts have no authority to take any action under Chapter 36, Water Code.

SECTION 2.4. DISSOLUTION OF CERTAIN DISTRICTS. On January 1, 2019:

- (1) the districts are dissolved;
- $% \left(2\right) =0$ the terms of the directors of the districts expire; and
 - (3) the aquifer district shall provide to the Texas

Commission on Environmental Quality notice of the dissolution of the districts.

SECTION 2.5. REPEALER. On January 1, 2019:

(1) Chapter 1147 (H.B. 3229), Acts of the 78th

Legislature, Regular Session, 2003, is repealed; and

- (2) the following chapters of the Special District Local Laws Code are repealed:
 - (A) Chapter 8810;
 - (B) Chapter 8838;
 - (C) Chapter 8843; and
 - (D) Chapter 8875.

ARTICLE 3. EFFECTIVE DATE

SECTION 3.1. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING AND AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, for some time, a controversy has existed involving land owners with real property fronting on or traversed by the upper reaches of Upper Cibolo Creek Road and other land owners who must use Upper Cibolo Creek Road, and in some instances, a private road originally known when deeded as Jamison Road (a portion of which is now known as Sky Rose Ranch), and another private road known when deeded and currently known as Rocky Top Road, to get to and from their real property, all located in Kendall County, Texas; and

WHEREAS, land owners who must use Upper Cibolo Creek Road, Sky Rose Ranch and Rocky Top Road to get to and from their real property, joined by other land owners with property fronting on or traversed by a private road known as Bella Springs Road, desire to resolve some of the issues involved in the controversy by creating an alternate route to access their property using Bella Springs Road; and

WHEREAS, Rodney Yates, the owner of the land traversed by Bella Springs Road, has indicated his agreement and intent to dedicate a minimum 60-foot wide road easement to Kendall County, such easement beginning at the intersection of Bella Springs Road and Upper Cibolo Creek Road, and following the center line of said Bella Springs Road continuing over an existing bridge across Cibolo Creek and continuing for a total distance of approximately 1740 feet, as shown on Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes; and

WHEREAS, Kevin Katzer, owner of property east of and adjacent to Bella Springs Road, who uses Bella Springs Road to access his property has indicated his agreement and intent to dedicate a 60-foot wide road easement to Kendall County for the construction of one leg of a hammer head turnaround, such easement beginning at the east ROW Line of Bella Springs Road and extending approximately 28 feet eastward, as shown on Exhibit B attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes; and

WHEREAS, The Springs Events, LLC, Larry Kruise, Operator, owner of a business west of and adjacent to the foregoing described segment of Bella Springs Road that uses Bella Springs Road to access the establishment has indicated the agreement and intent to pay for improvements to that part of Bella Springs Road shown in Exhibit A and to bring such roadway into compliance with the standards for county roads required by Kendall County, said improvements being more specifically described in Exhibit C attached here to and incorporated herein for all purposes; and

WHEREAS, Steven M. and Geri A. Clouse (the Clouses), owners of property located east of and adjacent to the property owned by Kevin Katzer (Katzer) have agreed with Katzer to an exchange of property, wherein Katzer will grant to the Clouses a sixty-foot wide strip of land located between their common boundary line and the east line of the sixty-foot road easement dedicated by Katzer in consideration for the Clouses granting to Katzer a portion of land east of their common boundary line, both tracts being shown on Exhibit D attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of such land owners that the Commissioners Court of Kendall County, upon satisfactory completion of the work described in Exhibit C, accept the dedication of such road easements on behalf of the public, accept the bridge that crosses Cibolo Creek as a county maintained bridge, and order that the portion of Bella Springs Road described in Exhibits A and B be opened as a county road; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Kendall County supports the proposed actions as being necessary to bring a peaceful resolution to the present conflict and to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Kendall County.

WHEREAS, all parties desire to memorialize the terms of the understanding and agreement:

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

Rodney Yates, Larry Kruise, Kevin Katzer, Steven M. Clouse, and Geri A. Clouse support the opening of a portion of Bella Springs Road as a county road and agree to comply with and respectively perform the five requirements set out herein in order to bring about its opening as a county road.

- 1. Rodney Yates, the owner of the land traversed by Bella Springs Road, agrees to dedicate a minimum 60-foot wide road easement to Kendall County, such easement beginning at the intersection of Bella Springs Road and Upper Cibolo Creek Road, and following the center line of said Bella Springs Road continuing over an existing bridge across Cibolo Creek and continuing for a total distance of approximately 1740 feet, as shown on Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes.
- Rodney Yates, the owner of the bridge traversing Cibolo Creek located at the intersection of Upper Cibolo Creek Road and Bella Springs Road agrees to donate and convey to Kendall County the right-of-way where the bridge is located and the bridge, including all appurtenances thereto, such right-of-way and bridge being shown on Exhibit A.
- 3. Kevin Katzer agrees to dedicate a 60-foot wide road easement to Kendall County for the construction of one leg of a hammer head turnaround, such easement beginning at the east ROW Line of Bella Springs Road and extending approximately 28 feet eastward, as shown on Exhibit B attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes.
- 4. The Springs Events, LLC, Larry Kruise, Operator, agrees to pay for improvements to that part of Bella Springs Road shown in Exhibit A and to bring such roadway into compliance with the standards for county roads required by Kendall County, said improvements being more specifically described in Exhibit C attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes.
- 5. Steven M. and Geri A. Clouse (the Clouses) and Kevin Katzer (Katzer) agree to an exchange of property as follows: Katzer will grant to the Clouses a sixty-foot wide strip of land located between their common boundary line and the east line of the sixty foot road easement dedicated by Katzer to Kendall County in consideration for the Clouses granting to Katzer a portion of land east of their common boundary line, both tracts being shown on Exhibit D attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes. Nothing in this Agreement shall prevent Katzer from selling the 13.39 acre remaining portion of his original 29.98 acre tract in accordance with the Kendall County development regulations in force at the time of the sale.

Upon the satisfactory completion of the five requirements set out herein, the Commissioners Court will proceed to open the portion of Bella Springs Road shown in Exhibits A and B as a third class county road.
