STATE OF TEXAS KENDALL COUNTY

LEASE AGREEMENT

PARTIES: The parties to this agreement are the owner of the Property, KENDALL COUNTY (Landlord) and the lessee of the Property, BOERNE SOCCER LEAGUE, and (Tenant).

PROPERTY: Landlord leases to Tenant that real property owned by Landlord which lies east of the Boerne Community Center and south of the Kendall County jail located northeast of the intersection of Adler and Staudt streets, Boerne, Kendall County, Texas, consisting of unimproved real property.

TERM: This lease commences on October 1, 2011 (Commencement Date) and ends on September 30, 2012 (Termination Date) unless terminated earlier in accordance with the terms set out herein or automatically extended in accordance with the terms set out herein.

TERMINATION: Tenant understands and agrees that if Landlord decides through its Commissioners Court to construct improvements on the property, use the property for some purpose or dispose of the property, Landlord may terminate this agreement by giving Tenant thirty (30) days written notice.

RENT: Tenant will pay Landlord rent in the amount of Ten and no/100 dollars (\$10.00).

UTILITIES: Tenant will pay all connection fees, service fees and usage fees for utilities to the premises (if any). Tenant will pay for collection of trash and garbage if required.

USE AND OCCUPANCY:

- 1. ALLOWABLE USES: Tenant shall use the premises for the following purposes: Activities associated with the Boerne Soccer League.
- 2. PROHIBITIONS: Tenant may not permit the premises to be used for any activity that is unlawful, offensive, dangerous or that constitutes a nuisance.

ACCESS BY LANDLORD: Landlord or other persons authorized by Landlord may enter the property by reasonable means and at reasonable times to inspect the property and for other lawful purposes.

MAINTENANCE AND UPKEEP OF THE PREMISES:

1. Tenant's responsibilities: Tenant shall keep the grounds mowed and in presentable condition. Tenant shall dispose of all trash, garbage and debris resulting from Tenant's occupancy. Tenant

shall take precautions to prevent damages to the premises. Tenant shall be responsible for making any repairs resulting from Tenant's use of the premises. Tenant shall promptly notify Landlord of any needed repairs or maintenance that are the responsibility of Landlord.

2. Landlord's responsibilities: Landlord shall be responsible for any major repairs to the premises, provided that if Landlord, in its sole discretion decides that such repairs are not feasible, Tenant may terminate the lease agreement and vacate the premises.

DEFAULT:

- 1. Default by Landlord: If Landlord breaches this lease, Tenant shall be entitled to seek any remedy allowed at law.
- 2. Default by Tenant: If Tenant breaches this lease, Landlord shall be entitled to seek any remedy allowed at law.
- 3. Attorney's fees and costs: The prevailing party in any litigation brought by either party to this lease against the other party to enforce any provision of this agreement, or to seek any remedy or relief pursuant to this agreement, shall be entitled to collect reasonable and necessary attorney's fees and costs of court from the losing party.

ABANDONMENT: If Tenant remains absent from the premises for thirty (30) days or longer without notifying Landlord or Landlord's agent of the reason for such absence and without maintaining the premises, Landlord shall be entitled to determine that Tenant has abandoned the premises and seek any remedy allowed by law.

ASSIGNMENT AND SUBLETTING: Tenant shall not assign or sublet the premises or any part thereof without Landlord's consent.

INSURANCE: In Tenant's discretion, Tenant may insure any property, including personal property, of Tenant located on the premises and obtain general liability insurance in an amount not less than the limits set forth in the Texas Tort Claims Act, Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code, Chapter 101 or successor statute, as applicable to a Texas County. If obtained such liability insurance shall name Landlord as an additional insured.

INDEMNIFICATION: Tenant does hereby agree to indemnify and hold harmless Landlord, its officers, agents and employees, against any and all claims, demands or causes of action that may be made against Landlord, its officers, agents or employees, by reason of, or in any way arising from this agreement or the performance of the terms of this agreement or Tenant's use and/or occupancy of the premises or arising from third parties use or presence on the premises during the term of this agreement, it being Tenant's intention to fully indemnify Landlord, its officers, agents and employees from any liability arising from this agreement.

EXTENSIONIRENEWAL: The parties may extend this lease agreement for any term of less than twelve (12) months by an agreement in writing approved by the parties and signed by the authorized representative of the parties. Unless either party notifies the other party in writing at least ninety (90) days prior to the end of the then current term of its desire to terminate this lease agreement or to modify the terms of this lease agreement, this lease agreement will be automatically renewed for a period of twelve (12) months.

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS:

- 1. LAW: The provisions of this agreement shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas. Venue for any suit arising from this agreement shall be in Kendall County, Texas.
- 2. ENTIRE AGREEMENT: This lease contains the entire agreement between the parties concerning the subject of the lease of the premises between the parties. No amendment to this agreement shall be valid unless it is in writing, signed by both parties or their authorized agent and dated subsequent to the date of this agreement.
- 3. BINDING EFFECT: This agreement is binding upon and inures to the benefit of the parties to this lease and to their respective heirs, executors, administrators, and permitted successors and assigns.
- 4. NOTICES: All notices under this agreement shall be delivered to the respective at the addresses indicated herein or such other addresses that the parties may designate in writing.
