GENERAL SUMMARY

Under direct supervision, the purpose of the position is to perform a variety of general road maintenance duties.

EXAMPLES OF ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

Duties may include but are not limited to the following:

Perform maintenance of roads and bridges including flagging and directing traffic through construction and maintenance zones; cutting brush, grass, and other vegetation; patching and sealing pavement.

Mixes concrete and mortar and shovels backfill to repair and maintain roads and bridges.

Repairs catch basins and completes other drainage work.

Operates select equipment for construction and maintenance projects including air compressor, basic skid steer with grapple bucket, forks, and broom, two yard rubber tired loader, brush chipper, single axle water truck and dump truck, air drill and jack hammer, mowers including rear brush hog, push and side mount rotary, pickup truck, rollers, six ton trailers, and chain saw weed eater, power and tow broom, quickie saw, plate compactor and jumping jack, basic backhoe, pressure washers, striping equipment, fence building equipment and bucket truck

Cleans culverts as needed.

EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING

Formal education that includes addition and subtraction and reading, writing, and speaking common English vocabulary; supplemented by three months of previous experience or training that includes road construction, work zone safety, and motorized equipment operation.

LICENSES AND CERTIFICATIONS

Must be able to obtain a valid commercial class A driver's license with a minimum of endorsement N, a health card or a P restriction, E & O restriction are allowed.
