

Kendall County COVID-19 Response

Update from Judge Darrel Lux

MARCH 29, 2020 – Your local leaders are continuing to work together to stop the spread of COVID-19 in Kendall County.

The City of Boerne and Kendall County have different restrictions in place. However, that does not mean that if you live outside the city limits that you should not practice safe and preventative behaviors. You should limit your distance from non-family members to 6 feet, stay at home except for obtaining the essential products you need and follow the CDC guidelines.

As of now, we are following Governor Abbott's declaration for the operation of businesses in the County. This does not mean businesses are free to operate in an unsafe manner. I ask that our local business owners be cautious and keep policies in place to lessen the exposure of the public and their employees to COVID-19. This is our action to date based on the factual information provided to us by the TX Department of State Health Services (DSHS). We are constantly monitoring available information and should things change in this very fluid environment, stricter regulations could be put in place.

It has been brought to my attention that there are neighborhoods where children are allowed to play outdoors together or congregate at their neighbors home. This is contradictive to the objective of keeping the kids home and out of school, PLEASE, keep your children at home and do not allow them to cluster. While we have heard that they may have a higher immunity to the COVID-19 virus, they can still contract and carry the virus, and endanger the at risk population around them. We need your cooperation to stop the spread.

Again, I continue to urge the citizens of Kendall County to be responsible in their actions and to use common sense. Also, practice good judgement if you have traveled to other countries, states, or portions of Texas that would pose an increased risk of exposure to the virus. Be cautious and move about the County only when necessary. We need to limit our exposure to protect the vulnerable population and those we love.
