COUNTY OF KENDALL It is ordered by the Commissioners' Court of Kendall County, Texas, to approve the final plat of Cordillera Ranch Subdivision Unit 220 in accordance to the Development Rules and Regulations and relief granted. ORDER RECOGINZING CERTAIN PREVIOUSLY APPROVED PLATS

WHEREAS, THE Commissioners Court of Kendall County must approve, by an order entered in the minutes of the court, a plat required by Tex. Loc. Gov't Code Ann §§ 232.001 et seq, as amended; and

WHEREAS, in the past, deeds, subdivisions of property, and other instruments affecting property were approved by Commissioners Court that were incorrectly approved and recorded in the Kendall County Clerk's Office resulting in incorrect or inaccurate information being reflected in the County's official public records; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court has the authority to delegate plat approval responsibility as provided by Tex. Loc. Gov't Code Ann § 232.0022; and

WHEREAS, amending plats or plat revisions have been prepared for property within the Town of Comfort and within WCID 1 and previously filed in the County Clerk's Office; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court desires to provide an expedited process for approval of plat corrections or plat amendments which merely reflect such existing situations in order to ensure that County records correctly indicate existing situations and to save the citizens of Kendall County unnecessary delay and expense; and

WHEREAS, in areas within Water Control and Improvement District Number 1 ("WCID 1") may be served by Central Water and Central Sewer; and

WHEREAS, amending plats or plat revisions have been prepared for property within the Town of Comfort and within WCID 1 and previously filed in the County Clerk's records; and

WHEREAS, these plats were incorrectly processed as amending plats or plat revisions when a new plat should have been submitted.

NOW THEREFORE, the following Order is adopted, effective immediately, concerning existing situations where deeds, subdivisions of property, and other instruments affecting property were recorded in the Kendall County Clerk's Office:

- 1. In areas served by WCID 1, the Kendall County Engineer is delegated the authority to file a document and/or instrument in the County Clerk's records correcting any previously approved plat to accurately reflect the plat as a "Final Plat" rather than "Amending Plat," or "Plat Revision".
- 2. The County Engineer shall certify that the previously approved plat was improperly named and record an affidavit referencing this Order with the Plat in the County Clerk's records.

KENDALL COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE RACIAL PROFILING REPORT 2023

The Kendall County Sheriff's Office, in accordance with the Texas Racial Profiling statues, collects law enforcement contact data for the purpose of identifying and responding to concerns regarding racial profiling practices. It is my hope that the findings in this report will serve as evidence that the Kendall County Sheriff's Office continues to strive towards the goal of maintaining strong relations will all members of the community.

In this report, the reader will encounter several sections designed to provide background information on the rationale and objectives of the Texas Racial Profiling Law. Other sections contain information relevant to the policies adopted by the Kendall County Sheriff's Office prohibiting the practice of racial profiling.

Analysis:

The data presented in this report contains information on traffic stops, or Kendall County Deputy traffic contacts with the public between January 1, 2023 and December 31, 2023. During that time period there were <u>no complaints</u> alleging racial profiling. Additionally, internal reviews of recorded traffic stops and a review of citations issued does not support any evidence of racial profiling on the part of Kendall County Deputies.

In 2023, 9,858 traffic stops were made which resulted in a traffic citation, warning citation, or an arrest. Of the 9,858 traffic stops conducted, 4.12% percent of persons stopped were Black, with 74.35% of persons stopped being White and 20.15% Hispanic. Asian/Pacific Islander, and Alaskan/American Indian accounted for 1.09% of the traffic stops.

Deputies reported that in 98.74% of the traffic stops the persons race was **not** know prior to the stop and 1.26% of the time the race of the occupant was known prior to the stop.

We believe these findings suggest the Kendall County Sheriff's Office does not experience a problem regarding racial profiling. The continuing effort to collect law enforcement contact data will assure an ongoing evaluation of the Kendall County Sheriff's Office practices. This will allow the citizens of Kendall County to benefit from professional and courteous service from their Sheriff's Office.

Art. 2.131. RACIAL PROFILING PROHIBITED. A peace officer may not engage in racial profiling.

Art. 2.132. LAW ENFORCEMENT POLICY ON RACIAL PROFILING. (a) In this article:

- (1) "Law enforcement agency" means an agency of the state, or of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of the state, that employs peace officers who make motor vehicle stops in the routine performance of the officers' official duties.
- (2) "Motor vehicle stop" means an occasion in which a peace officer stops a motor vehicle for an alleged violation of a law or ordinance.
- (3) "Race or ethnicity" means the following categories:
 - (A) Alaska native or American Indian;
 - (B) Asian or Pacific Islander;
 - (C) black;
 - (D) white; and
 - (E) Hispanic or Latino.
- (b) Each law enforcement agency in this state shall adopt a detailed written policy on racial profiling.

The policy must:

- (1) clearly define acts constituting racial profiling;
- (2) strictly prohibit peace officers employed by the agency from engaging in racial profiling;
- (3) implement a process by which an individual may file a complaint with the agency if the individual believes that a peace officer employed by the agency has engaged in racial profiling with respect to the individual;
- (4) provide public education relating to the agency's compliment and complaint process, including providing the telephone number, mailing address, and e-mail address to make a compliment or complaint with respect to each ticket, citation, or warning issued by a peace officer;
- (5) require appropriate corrective action to be taken against a peace officer employed by the agency who, after an investigation, is shown to have engaged in racial profiling in violation of the agency's policy adopted under this article;
- (6) require collection of information relating to motor vehicle stops in which a ticket, citation, or warning is issued and to arrests made as a result of those stops, including information relating to:
 - A. the race or ethnicity of the individual detained;
 - B. whether a search was conducted and, if so, whether the individual detained consented to the search;
 - C. whether the peace officer knew the race or ethnicity of the individual detained before detaining that individual;

- D. whether the peace officer used physical force that resulted in bodily injury, as that term is defined by Section 1.07, Penal Code, during the stop;
- E. the location of the stop; and
- F the reason for the stop; and
- (7) require the chief administrator of the agency, regardless of whether the administrator is elected, employed, or appointed, to submit an annual report of the information collected under Subdivision (6) to:
 - (A) the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement; and
 - (B) the governing body of each county or municipality served by the agency, if the agency is an agency of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of the state.
- (c) The data collected as a result of the reporting requirements of this article shall not constitute prima facie evidence of racial profiling.
- (d) On adoption of a policy under Subsection (b), a law enforcement agency shall examine the feasibility of installing video camera and transmitter-activated equipment in each agency law enforcement motor vehicle regularly used to make motor vehicle stops and transmitter-activated equipment in each agency law enforcement motorcycle regularly used to make motor vehicle stops. The agency also shall examine the feasibility of equipping each peace officer who regularly detains or stops motor vehicles with a body worn camera, as that term is defined by Section 1701.651, Occupations Code. If a law enforcement agency installs video or audio equipment or equips peace officers with body worn cameras as provided by this subsection, the policy adopted by the agency under Subsection (b) must include standards for reviewing video and audio documentation.
- (e) A report required under Subsection (b)(7) may not include identifying information about a peace officer who makes a motor vehicle stop or about an individual who is stopped or arrested by a peace officer. This subsection does not affect the collection of information as required by a policy under Subsection (b)(6).
- (f) On the commencement of an investigation by a law enforcement agency of a complaint described by Subsection (b)(3) in which a video or audio recording of the occurrence on which the complaint is based was made, the agency shall promptly provide a copy of the recording to the peace officer who is the subject of the complaint on written request by the officer.
- (g) On a finding by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement that the chief administrator of a law enforcement agency intentionally failed to submit a report required under Subsection (b)(7), the commission shall begin disciplinary procedures against the chief administrator.
- (h) A law enforcement agency shall review the data collected under Subsection (b)(6) to identify any improvements the agency could make in its practices and policies regarding motor vehicle stops.

- **Art. 2.133. REPORTS REQUIRED FOR MOTOR VEHICLE STOPS**. (a) In this article, "race or ethnicity" has the meaning assigned by Article 2.132(a).
- (b) A peace officer who stops a motor vehicle for an alleged violation of a law or ordinance shall report to the law enforcement agency that employs the officer information relating to the stop, including:
 - (1) a physical description of any person operating the motor vehicle who is detained as a result of the stop, including:
 - (A) the person's gender; and
 - (B) the person's race or ethnicity, as stated by the person or, if the person does not state the person's race or ethnicity, as determined by the officer to the best of the officer's ability;
 - (2) the initial reason for the stop;
 - (3) whether the officer conducted a search as a result of the stop and, if so, whether the person detained consented to the search;
 - (4) whether any contraband or other evidence was discovered in the course of the search and a description of the contraband or evidence;
 - (5) the reason for the search, including whether:
 - (A) any contraband or other evidence was in plain view;
 - (B) any probable cause or reasonable suspicion existed to perform the search; or
 - (C) the search was performed as a result of the towing of the motor vehicle or the arrest of any person in the motor vehicle;
 - (6) whether the officer made an arrest as a result of the stop or the search, including a statement of whether the arrest was based on a violation of the Penal Code, a violation of a traffic law or ordinance, or an outstanding warrant and a statement of the offense charged;
 - (7) the street address or approximate location of the stop;
 - (8) whether the officer issued a verbal or written warning or a ticket or citation as a result of the stop; and
 - (9) whether the officer used physical force that resulted in bodily injury, as that term is defined by Section 1.07, Penal Code, during the stop.
- (c) The chief administrator of a law enforcement agency, regardless of whether the administrator is elected, employed, or appointed, is responsible for auditing reports under Subsection (b) to ensure that the race or ethnicity of the person operating the motor vehicle is being reported.

Art. 2.134. COMPILATION AND ANALYSIS OF INFORMATION COLLECTED.

- (a) In this article:
 - (1) "Motor vehicle stop" has the meaning assigned by Article 2.132(a).
 - (2) "Race or ethnicity" has the meaning assigned by Article 2.132(a).
- (b) A law enforcement agency shall compile and analyze the information contained in each report received by the agency under Article 2.133. Not later than March 1 of each year, each law enforcement agency shall submit a report containing the incident-based data compiled during the previous calendar year to the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement and, if the law enforcement agency is a local law enforcement agency, to the governing body of each county or municipality served by the agency.
- (c) A report required under Subsection (b) must be submitted by the chief administrator of the law enforcement agency, regardless of whether the administrator is elected, employed, or appointed, and must include:
 - (1) a comparative analysis of the information compiled under Article 2.133 to:
 - (A) evaluate and compare the number of motor vehicle stops, within the applicable jurisdiction, of persons who are recognized as racial or ethnic minorities and persons who are not recognized as racial or ethnic minorities;
 - (B) examine the disposition of motor vehicle stops made by officers employed by the agency, categorized according to the race or ethnicity of the affected persons, as appropriate, including any searches resulting from stops within the applicable jurisdiction; and
 - (C) evaluate and compare the number of searches resulting from motor vehicle stops within the applicable jurisdiction and whether contraband or other evidence was discovered in the course of those searches; and
 - (2) information relating to each complaint filed with the agency alleging that a peace officer employed by the agency has engaged in racial profiling.
- (d) A report required under Subsection (b) may not include identifying information about a peace officer who makes a motor vehicle stop or about an individual who is stopped or arrested by a peace officer. This subsection does not affect the reporting of information required under Article 2.133(b)(1).
- (e) The Texas Commission on Law Enforcement, in accordance with Section <u>1701.162</u>, Occupations Code, shall develop guidelines for compiling and reporting information as required by this article.
- (f) The data collected as a result of the reporting requirements of this article shall not constitute prima facie evidence of racial profiling.

- (g) On a finding by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement that the chief administrator of a law enforcement agency intentionally failed to submit a report required under Subsection (b), the commission shall begin disciplinary procedures against the chief administrator.
- **Art. 2.136. LIABILITY**. A peace officer is not liable for damages arising from an act relating to the collection or reporting of information as required by Article <u>2.133</u> or under a policy adopted under Article <u>2.132</u>.
- **Art. 2.137. PROVISION OF FUNDING OR EQUIPMENT**. (a) The Department of Public Safety shall adopt rules for providing funds or video and audio equipment to law enforcement agencies for the purpose of installing video and audio equipment in law enforcement motor vehicles and motorcycles or equipping peace officers with body worn cameras, including specifying criteria to prioritize funding or equipment provided to law enforcement agencies. The criteria may include consideration of tax effort, financial hardship, available revenue, and budget surpluses. The criteria must give priority to:
 - (1) law enforcement agencies that employ peace officers whose primary duty is traffic enforcement;
 - (2) smaller jurisdictions; and
 - (3) municipal and county law enforcement agencies.
- (b) The Department of Public Safety shall collaborate with an institution of higher education to identify law enforcement agencies that need funds or video and audio equipment for the purpose of installing video and audio equipment in law enforcement motor vehicles and motorcycles or equipping peace officers with body worn cameras. The collaboration may include the use of a survey to assist in developing criteria to prioritize funding or equipment provided to law enforcement agencies.
- (c) To receive funds or video and audio equipment from the state for the purpose of installing video and audio equipment in law enforcement motor vehicles and motorcycles or equipping peace officers with body worn cameras, the governing body of a county or municipality, in conjunction with the law enforcement agency serving the county or municipality, shall certify to the Department of Public Safety that the law enforcement agency needs funds or video and audio equipment for that purpose.
- (d) On receipt of funds or video and audio equipment from the state for the purpose of installing video and audio equipment in law enforcement motor vehicles and motorcycles or equipping peace officers with body worn cameras, the governing body of a county or municipality, in conjunction with the law enforcement agency serving the county or municipality, shall certify to the Department of Public Safety that the law enforcement agency has taken the necessary actions to use and is using video and audio equipment and body worn cameras for those purposes.

Art. 2.138. RULES. The Department of Public Safety may adopt rules to implement Articles 2.131-2.137.

Art. 2.1385. CIVIL PENALTY. (a) If the chief administrator of a local law enforcement agency intentionally fails to submit the incident-based data as required by Article 2.134, the agency is liable to the state for a civil penalty in an amount not to exceed \$5,000 for each violation. The attorney general may sue to collect a civil penalty under this subsection.

- (b) From money appropriated to the agency for the administration of the agency, the executive director of a state law enforcement agency that intentionally fails to submit the incident-based data as required by Article 2.134 shall remit to the comptroller the amount of \$1,000 for each violation.
- (c) Money collected under this article shall be deposited in the state treasury to the credit of the general revenue fund.

Informing the Public on the Process of Filing a Complaint with the Kendall County Sheriff's Office

(I) EDUCATIONAL CAMPAIGN:

In accordance with the Texas Racial Profiling statute, the Kendall County Sheriff's Office has launched an educational campaign aimed at informing the public on issues relevant to the complaint process.

Emphasis has been placed on informing community members on filing a complaint relevant to racial profiling practices.

The Sheriff of Kendall County has informed the community on efforts being made by the Sheriff's Office to continue banning racial profiling practices among its deputies. In addition, a series of pamphlets have been made available to the community in an effort to reach out to individuals in the community.

(II) FILING A COMPLAINT BASED ON VIOLATIONS OF THE TEXAS LAW ON RACIAL PROFILING

The necessary information is available to residents of Kendall County:

(III) A COMMITMENT TO RESPOND TO THE NEEDS OF THE COMMUNITY

The Kendall County Sheriff's Office has made a commitment to its citizens regarding the following:

- 1. The Sheriff's Office shall accept complaints from any person who believes he or she has been stopped or searched based on racial, ethnic or national origin profiling. No person shall be discouraged, intimidated or coerced from filing a complaint, nor discriminated against because he or she filed such a complaint.
- 2. Any employee who receives an allegation of racial profiling, including the deputy who initiated the stop, shall record the person's name, address and telephone number, and forward the complaint through the appropriate channel or direct the individual(s) to a supervisory officer. Any employee contacted shall provide to that person a copy of a complaint form or the Sheriff's Office process for filing a complaint. All employees will report any allegation of racial profiling to their superior before the end of their shift.
- 3. Investigation of a complaint shall be conducted in a thorough and timely manner. All complaints will be acknowledged in writing to the initiator who will receive disposition regarding said complaint within a reasonable period of time. The investigation shall be reduced to writing and any reviewer's Comments or conclusions shall be filed with the Sheriff. When applicable, findings and/or suggestions for disciplinary action, retraining, or changes in policy shall be filed with the Sheriff.
- 4. If a racial profiling complaint is sustained against a deputy, it will result in appropriate corrective and/or disciplinary action, up to and including termination.
- 5. If there is a Sheriff's Office video or audio recording of the events upon which a complaint of racial profiling is based, upon commencement of an investigation by the Sheriff's Office into the complaint and written request of the deputy made the subject of the complaint, this office shall promptly provide a copy of the recording to that deputy.



Filing a Complaint with the Kendall County Sheriff's Office

*The following information is available to the public as part of an educational campaign aimed at informing community members of the complaint process relevant to violations of the Texas Racial Profiling Law.

UNDERSTANDING THE PROCESS

Once an individual has filed a complaint regarding racial profiling, he/she should expect the following process to commence:

THE INTERVIEW

A supervisor (rank of sergeant or higher) will interview the individual filing the complaint. The supervisor

will ask questions about what happened. It is possible that the supervisor may be able to explain the Deputy(s)' actions to your satisfaction.

- Usually, the alleged victim will be interviewed at the Sheriff's Office Main Building.
 It is possible that he/she may be videotaped during the interview.
- Complainant will be asked to put his/her complaint in writing per state law.
- The individual filing the complaint may bring a lawyer, family member or friend to the interview.
- The supervisor will ask the individual filing a complaint for the names of witnesses and other Law Enforcement officers that may know facts about the complaint.
- Photographs may be taken of any injuries that the alleged victim think are related to the complaint.

THE INVESTIGATION

After the interview, the Kendall County Sheriff's Office will investigate the alleged misconduct. Investigators will talk to witnesses and visit the site of the incident.

- The investigators will consist of supervisors assigned by the Chief Deputy.
- All Deputies will be interviewed and witnesses whom the alleged victim has named

will be contacted and interviewed, if they agree.

- The alleged victim will receive a letter regarding the progress of the investigation. Although it is impossible to estimate how long the investigation will take, the alleged victim will receive periodic reports on its status.
- A report will then be prepared.

THE REVIEW PROCESS

The Chief Deputy reviews every complaint after the investigation is completed and a report is written.

- If the complaint includes excessive force or charges a Deputy with a crime, it will also be referred to be investigated by the Texas Rangers.
- The Chief Deputy will review your complaint, statement's from all witnesses and reports from the investigation. The Chief Deputy may ask for additional information before making his recommendations to the Sheriff.
- The Sheriff reviews the results of all investigations and makes the final decision on all complaints.

THE FINDINGS

The results of your complaint are called "findings." There are four possible findings:

- **Sustained** The complaint has been supported: The deputy(s) involved acted improperly and may be disciplined.
- **Unfounded** The investigation found no basis to the complaint filed.
- Exonerated The deputy(s) involved acted properly and will not be disciplined; or
- **Not provable** There was not enough evidence to prove the complaint true or false so no further action will be taken.

The Sheriff will decide on a finding after the complaint has been reviewed. The alleged victim will also be informed of the final decision through an official letter.

- 1) clearly defines acts constituting racial profiling;
- 2) strictly prohibits peace officers employed by the <u>KENDALL CO. SHERIFF'S OFFICE</u> from engaging in racial profiling;
- 3) implements a process by which an individual may file a complaint with the <u>KENDALL CO. SHERIFF'S</u> <u>OFFICE</u> if the individual believes that a peace officer employed by the <u>KENDALL CO. SHERIFF'S OFFICE</u> has engaged in racial profiling with respect to the individual;
- 4) provides public education relating to the agency's complaint process;
- 5) requires appropriate corrective action to be taken against a peace officer employed by the <u>KENDALL CO.</u> <u>SHERIFF'S OFFICE</u> who, after an investigation, is shown to have engaged in racial profiling in violation of the <u>KENDALL CO. SHERIFF'S OFFICE</u> policy;
- 6) requires collection of information relating to motor vehicle stops in which a warning or citation is issued and to arrests made as a result of those stops, including information relating to:
 - a. the race or ethnicity of the individual detained;
 - b. whether a search was conducted and, if so, whether the individual detained consented to the search;
 - c. whether the peace officer knew the race or ethnicity of the individual detained before detaining that individual:
 - d. whether the peace officer used physical force that resulted in bodily injury during the stop;
 - e. the location of the stop;
 - f. the reason for the stop.
- 7) requires the chief administrator of the agency, regardless of whether the administrator is elected, employed, or appointed, to submit an annual report of the information collected under Subdivision (6) to:
 - a. the Commission on Law Enforcement; and
 - b. the governing body of each county or municipality served by the agency, if the agency is an agency of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of the state.

Purpose

Kendall County ("the County") is committed to compliance with the Texas Public Information Act ("the Act") (Texas Government Code Chapter 552). The purpose of this policy is to guide the County's handling of and responses to requests for information under the Act.

Policy

- 1.1. All information and records held by the County are public unless they fall within a specific exception to the Texas Public Information Act. Each department is responsible for ensuring compliance with the Act. Every Kendall County employee is required to take Texas Public Information Act Training on an annual basis and will provide the course certificate evidencing completion to Human Resources to be placed in the employee's personnel file.
- 1.2. In accordance with Tex. Gov't Code Ann. § 552.324, all requests for information shall be directed to the County's website for receiving TPIA requests once the website is live and ready to accept requests. The County shall post this information on the sign required by Tex. Gov't Code Ann. § 552.204 and on the County's website. Prior to live production of the County's internet request site, all written requests shall be submitted to the following email address: ________. Any County personnel receiving inquiries concerning disclosure of information should inform the Requestor to submit their request in writing as provided by section 1.2.
- 1.3. Upon receiving a request, the Kendall County Criminal District Attorney's Office and/or the Kendall County General Counsel shall forward the request to the appropriate department. The offices will work together to determine whether the information falls within an exception to the Act. If an exception is claimed under the Act, the Kendall County Criminal District Attorney's Office and/or the Kendall County General Counsel will request a ruling from the Attorney General of Texas. The request for a ruling from the Attorney General must be made within the time specified by the Act or the information is deemed public and may be subject to public disclosure.
- 1.3. Kendall County Criminal District Attorney's Office and/or the Kendall County General Counsel may coordinate the release of any requested information and will determine the appropriate charges to the requestor for duplication of records using the guidelines of the Office of the Attorney General. The Kendall County Criminal District Attorney's Office and/or the Kendall County General Counsel may elect to waive charges if the cost of collecting the amount owed exceeds the actual amount charged.
- 1.4. Pursuant to Texas Government Code section 552.275, the County has established a time limit on the amount of time County personnel are required to spend producing public information for inspection or duplication by a requestor, or providing copies of public information to a requestor without recovering its costs attributable to that personnel time. The time limit which has been established by the County shall be 36 hours per fiscal year. Requestors who exceed the 36 hour time limit will be required to pay costs attributable to

cost of materials, overhead, and personnel time even when the requestor intends to only inspect the documents. This section does not apply to those requestors exempted by Texas Government Code section 552.275.
