a hearing, the parties and lawyers can learn what the general rules are, what is expected of them when in court, and how they can move their case along efficiently and quickly.

This organized process saves the litigants money and the County time. The County Clerk's Office and I shifted from Zoom/internet hearings to actual live, in-person hearings. As a 20-year lawyer and, now, as a judge presiding over these important matters, I firmly believe that live, in-person proceedings add value to both the parties' experience in the judicial system, as well as engendering the necessary respect due to the judicial

process. We will afford non-local litigants the opportunity to appear via Zoom/internet, but the default for someone who asks for "their day in court" will be to give them an actual day in court, unless special circumstances exist.

COMMUNITY and EMPLOYEE OUTREACH:

In addition to the monthly Roundtable Discussions, I have made it a point to visit with employees or citizens on a regular basis. So far, I have had the pleasure of meeting with over 100 citizens, elected officials, and community groups.

General Provisions

The Plan Sponsor (hereinafter “you”), having established a retirement plan (hereinafter “Plan”), hereby retains American United Life Insurance Company® of Indianapolis, Indiana, a OneAmerica® company (hereinafter “we, us, our, or AUL”) to assist in providing the recordkeeping, administrative and other services described herein. “Plan Sponsor” also means “administrator” as that term is defined under ERISA §3(16)(A).

AUL is not a fiduciary or a party to the Plan. We perform administrative functions for you within a framework of policies, interpretations, rules, practices, and procedures established by you. Accordingly, you or the prior plan recordkeeper shall furnish us with all necessary information we may require to carry out our duties. All services provided by us will be based on the data maintained in our records or information supplied by you or the prior plan recordkeeper. We shall be entitled to rely exclusively upon information furnished by you or the prior plan recordkeeper and shall have no duty to look beyond such information. Material will be prepared to the extent possible based on such information and data.

Full responsibility for final completion and timely filing of regulatory forms with the Internal Revenue Service, the Department of Labor, or any other governmental agency lies with you. You shall indemnify, protect and hold us harmless from any losses, liabilities, claims and expenses in connection therewith, including counsel fees and court costs, arising out of inadequate or inaccurate data supplied by you, the Contractholder, Trustees, and other fiduciaries, or their failure to forward reports prepared by us.

AUL Group Annuity Contract

“Contract” means the AUL Group Annuity Contract used to fund your Plan. This Agreement or any Amendments thereto do not affect either party’s duties or obligations under the Contract.

Services

AUL provides numerous services to assist in the operation and management of the Plan, as well as to your employees to help them fully benefit from the Plan and its many provisions. Our services are described in Exhibit A.

Facsimile/Electronic Media Acceptance

Instructions provided to us by you to execute, cancel, or otherwise proceed with transactions, including those related to, but not limited to, enrollments (except for AUL American Series Annuity Enrollment Forms), loan applications, distributions, and correspondence, will be accepted via facsimile, copy, or other electronic media. This does not apply to retirement plan adoption agreements, group annuity contract applications, or amendments thereto, the New Business Agreement, or Notice, Election & Release documents.

You hereby agree that we will not be responsible for any claims, losses, liabilities, or expenses, including legal fees and expenses, resulting from any action taken or not taken by us in reliance on such instructions.



AUL Internet and Telephone Services

You instruct us to make both online (www.OneAmerica.com) account access and interactive voice response services (OneAmerica TeleServe® system) available to participants with accounts held under the Contract. In addition, you hereby appoint us as your agent for the sole purpose of executing Plan participants' investment and withdrawal instructions through the AUL Web site and telephone system. It is understood that AUL will execute Plan participants' investment instructions received through the OneAmerica TeleServe® system or the OneAmerica Web site effective as of the close of business on the valuation date, as referenced in your Contract, in which AUL receives the request. Instructions received after 4 pm Eastern Time will be effective on the next day that the New York Stock Exchange is open for trading. It is further understood that AUL has no discretion or authority to alter or decline to execute any Plan participant investment instructions received through the OneAmerica TeleServe® system or the OneAmerica Web site, unless such instructions are impossible to execute. If any such instructions are impossible to execute, AUL will so notify the participant before the instructions are accepted by OneAmerica TeleServe® system or the OneAmerica Web site. All investment instructions received and executed through the OneAmerica TeleServe® system or the OneAmerica Web site will be confirmed in writing to the Plan participant within ten business days.

Optional Services

Certain optional services are available upon request as listed in Exhibit C. These services include assistance with special plan design (e.g., Individually Designed Plans, Non-AUL Documents, advanced plan compliance and administrative/recordkeeping rework, etc.) or rework requests for any services already delivered (e.g., revised annual reporting, Form 5500 revisions, and/or revised non-discrimination testing, etc.). If the requested rework requires adjustments to a financial transaction that involves variable investment funds, you will be responsible for any loss incurred by participant accounts as a result of market fluctuations. Fees and Payments

The fees for AUL's services are described in Exhibit C and are to be paid on a quarterly basis unless otherwise specified in this Agreement or any Amendments thereto.

All fees assessed by us shall be paid in full by you on or before the applicable payment due date. If any amounts remain unpaid for a period of sixty (60) days after the payment due date, we reserve the right to do one or more of the following:

- Initiate a collection action to secure full and complete payment of any and all amounts that are past due. In the event such action is taken, you are responsible for payment of the original debt, and any and all costs necessary in such action, including, but not limited to, service fees, postage, collection agency fees, court costs and fees, attorney fees, and all other fees necessary to enforce collection and judgments concerning your debt.
- Deduct such amounts (excluding late fees, which will be billed to you) from participant accounts on a pro-rata basis, if this option is provided for in the Contract.

The fees described in Exhibit C are not guaranteed. At our option and upon thirty (30) days notice to you, we may amend the fee schedule by adding or changing any fee.

Either party may terminate this Agreement thereto by providing thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. If you terminate this Agreement thereto prior to the end of a Plan Year, fees for the final Plan Year will be determined and assessed assuming completion of a full Plan Year and will be due prior to valuation of assets.

Standard contract termination processing includes providing a paper listing of participant account values and a single sum payment and/or annual installment payments by check or wire transfer to you or to whomever you direct. Estimate of Recordkeeping Cost:

The recordkeeping services identified above will be provided to the Plan without an explicit charge, and AUL expects to receive revenue from investment management companies that will be used, in part, to offset the expenses and costs of those services. Accordingly, AUL is obligated by Department of Labor regulation to provide you with a reasonable and good faith estimate of the cost of these recordkeeping services to your Plan.

To develop the estimate, AUL analyzed its most recent calendar year expenses attributable to retirement plans funded by an AUL group annuity contract (its "Total Expenses") and subtracted expenses not directly related to providing recordkeeping services (primarily expenses related to sales, marketing and investment management functions), which left AUL's "Recordkeeping Expenses." AUL then developed a Recordkeeping Ratio, which is the ratio of Recordkeeping Expenses to Total Expenses. This Recordkeeping Ratio was applied to the retained revenue that AUL expects in connection with plans similar to yours, resulting in the estimate of the cost of recordkeeping services to your Plan. In determining whether a plan was similar to yours, AUL considered the services available to your Plan, the number of participants, and the amount of plan assets.

Based on this methodology, AUL estimates the cost of the recordkeeping services provided to your Plan will be 1.67% of the total assets under your Contract. AUL will then purchase shares of the corresponding mutual fund portfolio or collective investment trust. Participants do not invest directly into any mutual fund, collective investment trust, or underlying investment.

NOTE: The AUL Stable Value Account is a required investment option. Options shown with an asterisk (*) on the Investment Options Chart are competing investments. Transfers up to one-hundred percent (100%) of the SVA balance may be made at any time; however, that amount may not be transferred to a competing investment. After a transfer from the SVA to a non-competing investment, 90 days must lapse before transferring any money to the SVA or a competing investment.

AUL and/or its affiliate, OneAmerica Securities, Inc. ("OAS") have contractual arrangements with the investment management companies that provide mutual funds or collective trusts that underlie the investment options offered by AUL in your group annuity contract. Pursuant to these arrangements, AUL and/or OAS receive revenue sharing payments from the investment management companies as compensation for providing plan participant recordkeeping, communication, marketing, distribution and other services to the investment management companies. These revenue sharing amounts consist of a portion of the expense ratio of the underlying mutual fund or collective trust investment and can take the form of 12b-1 fees, subtransfer agency fees, shareholder servicing fees or other types of fees. The amount of revenue sharing received by AUL and/or OAS varies from one underlying investment option to another and is shown on the investment chart above. Included in these revenue sharing amounts are those paid to OAS by OneAmerica Funds, Inc., an AUL and OAS affiliate.

Exhibit C: Fee Schedule

This document is intended to provide the Plan Sponsor and all Plan fiduciaries with the information necessary for them to make informed decisions about the services to be provided by AUL in connection with the referenced Plan and the cost of these services. In providing this information, this document will serve as the initial fee disclosure document required by the U.S. Department of Labor (DOL) regulation §2550.408b-2(c). This regulation requires covered service providers to the plan to make disclosures to the responsible plan fiduciaries. A responsible plan fiduciary is “a fiduciary with authority to cause the covered plan to enter into, or extend or renew, the contract or arrangement.” If you are not the responsible plan fiduciary for the plan, please forward this disclosure to a responsible plan fiduciary immediately.

An AUL group annuity contract(s) is the funding vehicle(s) for the Plan. This Contract includes the investment options selected in Exhibit B.

AUL credits interest to amounts allocated to the fixed interest/stable value investment option at interest rates determined and declared in advance by AUL. All such rates will be equal to or greater than any applicable minimum guaranteed interest rate. At all times amounts allocated to these options and all interest credited is fully guaranteed by AUL and backed by the assets of AUL’s general account.

Variable investment options are provided through investment accounts within an AUL separate account, which are supported by securities purchased as directed by the group annuity contractholder and/or Plan participants. In general these securities are shares of mutual funds and/or collective investment trusts that have been screened and selected by AUL to provide multiple options based upon different investment styles and objectives.

In addition to providing the group annuity contract(s) as the funding vehicle(s) for the Plan, AUL will provide the services listed in Exhibit A.

In compensation for its professional services in connection with providing the group annuity contract(s) as funding vehicle(s), providing recordkeeping and administrative services and the acquisition costs, compliance support, sales office expenses, overhead, sales commissions, annuity purchase rate guarantees, reasonable profit, and other related costs, AUL receives compensation from the following:

- Direct charges: These are charges that are billed to the Plan Sponsor or deducted from participant accounts if properly authorized.
- Asset Charge: This charge is a stated percentage of the assets in the variable separate account investment options and may be collected by way of the calculation of the unit price of a separate account investment option.
- Revenue Sharing: These are amounts received from the investment management companies that provide the mutual funds or collective trust investments that underlie the separate account investment option offered by AUL in the Contract.

Additionally, American United Life Insurance Company (AUL) earns interest on the aggregate cash balance held by AUL in its omnibus bank account with respect to (1) contributions received but not allocated or (2) benefits and other disbursements paid but not cashed or cleared by its bank. Such interest will be at money market rates applicable to very short term investments, and will be retained by AUL as compensation for the services provided to the Plan and its participants.

Contributions received by AUL prior to the close of the New York Stock Exchange (NYSE) are allocated to the group annuity contract(s) that serves as the funding vehicle for the Plan and to participant accounts thereunder the same day as they are received if the contributions are accompanied with deposit information in good order. Contributions received after the close of the NYSE are allocated the next business day after receipt. Contributions received without deposit information in good order are held by AUL until the necessary information is received

or for seven days whichever comes first. Once seven days passes, the contributions are returned to the plan sponsor or the employer. Unallocated amounts are held in AUL's omnibus cash account and could earn interest at money market rates applicable to very short term investments.

When AUL makes a distribution from the group annuity contract that serves as a funding vehicle for the Plan, funds are transferred from a contract's or participant's account to a disbursement account on the day the distribution is made. Distributions not yet cleared are held in AUL's omnibus cash account and interest will be earned by AUL at money market rates applicable to very short term investments beginning on the date the funds are transferred to the disbursement account and ending on the date the distribution clears through AUL's bank. The timing of the clearing process is beyond AUL's control.

AUL has agreed to timely and accurately process transaction orders received in good order prior to market close. However, from time to time inadvertent errors are made by AUL personnel. When that happens, AUL will correct the error as soon as practical after AUL has sufficient information to do so. In making the correction, AUL will put the impacted plan and/or participant in a financially equivalent position as would have existed had no error been made. This means AUL will make the plan and/or the participant whole for any loss resulting from an error correction. If the correction results in there being a gain, AUL will keep the gain as additional compensation for the services it provides to the plan.

By executing the Administrative Services Agreement, you are authorizing AUL to make inadvertent error corrections as explained above.

Fees for plan administrative, legal, accounting, and other services are paid by the Plan Sponsor. However, the Plan Sponsor may direct that these fees be assessed against participant accounts on a pro rata or per capita basis.

Exhibit D: Revenue Account Agreement

Pursuant to this Revenue Account Agreement, Plan Sponsor and Plan Fiduciary hereby direct AUL to establish and maintain an account under the Contract called the Revenue Account (the “Account”).

1. The Account is for bookkeeping purposes only and does not reflect any actual assets and does not give the Plan or any participant or beneficiary of the Plan any right, title or interest in specific assets prior to the time amounts are allocated to accounts of the Plan’s participants under the Contract. The Account shall be maintained at face value and shall not be credited with any earnings or interest.
2. AUL shall credit to the Account an amount calculated pursuant to the formula below, which corresponds to the Plan’s Adviser’s fee for services based on information provided to AUL by the Plan and/or its Adviser.
3. The Plan Sponsor may instruct AUL in writing to make payment(s) from the Account for any reasonable Plan expenses that are not the obligation of the Plan Sponsor. In making such payment(s), AUL shall act solely at the direction of the Plan Sponsor and shall not have or exercise any discretion or control over any such payment(s). The Plan Sponsor shall be solely responsible for determining, and shall represent, that the payment of any expense from the Account as directed is consistent with the Plan’s governing documents and ERISA. The Agreement dated October 6th, 2016 by and between Kendall County (County) and Buc-ee's, Ltd. (Company) attached hereto for your convenience, stipulates in Article Two that the Project is "to be more specifically described by metes and bounds description, mutually acceptable to the parties and to be made part of this Agreement by an addendum". To that end, please see the attached draft of the "Buc-ee's #41; Final Plat Creating Lots 1,2, and 3".


With this letter, Buc-ee's is requesting the County's concurrence with the depiction of Lot 1 as the amended description of the Project. Upon approval, Company will prepare a metes and bounds description to be incorporated into the Agreement by addendum (First Addendum). With regard to Article Nine of the Agreement and the urgency of this matter, we respectfully request the deliberation of this First Addendum be added to the agenda of the May 22nd meeting of Commissioners Court (Meeting).

Please also know that we received a copy of Matthew Grove's letter to TXDOT dated May 17th, 2023 stating the County's intention to purchase the TXDOT Surplus Property known as "+- 2.873 acres; D15-131-480". **AGREEMENT TO STIMULATE, ENCOURAGE AND DEVELOP BUSINESS LOCATION AND
COMMERCIAL ACTIVITY IN KENDALL COUNTY**

This Agreement to Stimulate, Encourage and Develop Business Location and Commercial Activity in Kendall County (the "Agreement") is made and entered into by and between Buc-ee's, Ltd. (the "Company") and Kendall County, Texas (the "County").

Recitals:

Whereas, the Company is considering the location of a business and commercial activity in the County consisting of a Travel Center Facility, together with retail development of pad sites (collectively the "Project"); and

Whereas, pursuant to Section 381.004 Texas Local Government Code, the Commissioners Court of County may develop and administer a program to stimulate, encourage, and develop business location and commercial activity in County by: (1) entering into a tax abatement agreement with an owner or lessee of a property interest subject to ad valorem taxation in County, and (2) by developing and administering a program for making loans and grants of public money and providing personnel and services of County; and

Whereas, the location of Project by Company in County would stimulate, encourage, and develop business location and commercial activity in County resulting in increased ad valorem taxes and sales taxes to County; and

Whereas, County and Company desire to enter into an agreement whereby County agrees to provide certain economic development incentives to Company in accordance with Section 381.004, Texas Local Government Code and other applicable statutes in consideration for Company locating a Travel Center Facility in County:

Now, therefore, County and Company, in consideration of the mutual benefits and promises contained herein, which shall include the improvement by Company of a portion of the real property wherein the Project is to be located, agree as follows:

**Article One
Authorization**

This Agreement is authorized by Section 381.004, Texas Local Government Code and other applicable statutes.

**Article Two
Definitions**

"Project Sales Tax Revenue" means that portion of taxable purchases and sales consummated by retail establishments, including, but not limited to, the Company's Travel Center Facility, in Kendall County, Texas. A sale of a taxable item is consummated as provided in Section 321.203, Texas Tax Code.

"Travel Center Facility" means the Company's place of business of the retailer (the Company), within the Project, in Kendall County, Texas as defined in Section 321.002(3), Texas Tax Code.

"Program" means the economic development program of County adopted pursuant to Chapter 381, Texas Local Government Code.

"Project" means all of the retail businesses located upon one or more tracts of land within the City of Boerne, Kendall County, Texas, to be more specifically described by metes and bounds description, mutually acceptable to the parties and to be made a part of this Agreement by an addendum. Said Property is generally depicted on the Site plan labeled **Exhibit A** attached hereto and incorporated herein.

"Program Payment" means the amount paid by the County to the Company each quarter under the Program.

"Retail Businesses" means the all of the places of business of retailers, as that term is more expressly defined in Section 321.002(3), Texas Tax Code.

"Sales Tax Revenues" means the amount of total sales tax received by the County as a direct result of purchases and sales through all Retail Businesses in the Project.

Article Three Term

The term of this Agreement is herein defined as the lesser of twenty (20) years or the maximum duration as allowed by law, beginning on January 1 of the year immediately following the date on which the Company's Travel Center Facility is substantially complete and business operations have commenced (the "Term").

Article Four Sales Tax Refund

During the Term of this Agreement, the County shall refund to the Company an amount equal to fifty percent (50%) of the Sales Tax Revenues.

Article Five Submission of Data

Within 30 days from the end of each calendar quarter, the Company shall submit to the County a schedule detailing the Project Sales Tax Revenues for that quarter (the "Schedule"). As backup for the Schedule, Company shall submit the following:

- (a) a copy of all sales tax reports, including amended reports, filed by the Retail Businesses in the Project for that quarter showing sales tax collected;
- (b) a copy of all direct payment and self-assessment returns, including amended returns, filed by the Retail Businesses in the Project for that quarter showing sales/use tax paid; and
- (c) information concerning any refund received by all Retail Businesses in the Project of sales tax paid by the Retail Businesses in the Project for sales tax collected.

The information contained in Article Five sections (a), (b) and (c) shall collectively be referred to as "Sales Tax Data." Notwithstanding anything contained herein to the contrary, in the event the Company fails to submit the required Sales Tax Data related to any Retail Business, other than the Travel Center Facility, such failure shall not be a material default hereunder, but Program Payments specifically related to those Retail Businesses for which the Sales Tax Data was not submitted shall thereafter be withheld until said Sales Tax Data is submitted. The Company shall certify in writing on or before the 30th day from the anniversary of this Agreement that the Company is in compliance with each applicable term of this Agreement, specifically pointing out what Sales Tax Data for Retail Businesses in the Project was not submitted.

Article Six Program Payment

Within 30 days of receipt of sales tax revenues from the State of Texas for the quarter covered by a Schedule submitted by the Company pursuant to Article Five, the County shall pay the Program Payment to the Company or as directed in writing by the Company.

Article Seven Computation of Program Payment

The Program Payment for the quarter shall be the sum of fifty percent (50%) of the Sales Tax Revenues. This payment is computed based on Project Sales Tax Revenues. If during the Term of this Agreement, state law applicable to county taxation changes, and, as a result, the Program Payment amount differs materially from the amount which would have been calculated if state law remained the same as in effect on the date of this Agreement, then the parties shall endeavor to adjust the Program Payment computation so as to achieve the same proportionate economic benefits to both parties as would have resulted if the law had not changed.

Article Eight Default

If either party should default (herein called the "Defaulting Party") with respect to any of its obligations hereunder and should fail, within thirty (30) days after delivery of written notice of such default from the other party (herein called the "Complaining Party") to cure such defaults, the Complaining Party, by action or proceeding at law or in equity, may be awarded its damages. Any Program Payment from the County to the Company required hereunder which is not timely paid by the County shall incur interest at the rate of five percent (5%) per annum. The interest shall accrue from the date such Program Payment is due until paid.

Article Nine Mutual Assistance

The County and the Company shall do all things necessary or appropriate to carry out the terms and provisions of this Agreement and to aid and assist each other in carrying out such terms and provisions. Company hereby consents to and agrees to cooperate in any reasonable request by the County to obtain copies of Sales/Use tax returns from the State, which contains information pertinent to the calculation of a Program Payment.

**Article Ten
Representations and Warranties**

The County represents and warrants to the Company that the Program and this Agreement are within the scope of its authority and it is duly authorized and empowered to establish the Program and enter into this Agreement. The Company represents and warrants to the County that it has the requisite authority to enter into this Agreement.

**Article Eleven
Amendment and Cancellation**

This Agreement may only be amended or altered by written instrument signed by the authorized representative of all parties. The County may cancel or modify this Agreement if the Company fails to comply with this Agreement.

**Article Twelve
Assignments**

This Agreement may not be assigned by the Company without prior written approval of the County, such approval not to be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed. Should this Agreement be assigned with permission of the County, it will be binding on and inure to the benefit of the parties, their respective successors and assigns.

**Article Thirteen
Severability**

In the event any provision of this Agreement is determined to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable under present or future laws, then and in that event, it is the intention of the parties hereto, that the remainder of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby, and it is also the intention of the parties to this Agreement that in lieu of each clause or provision that is found to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable a provision be added to this Agreement which is legal, valid and enforceable and is as similar in terms as possible to the provision found to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable.

**Article Fourteen
Venue**

This Agreement shall be governed by, construed and enforced in accordance with, and subject to the laws of the State of Texas. Venue shall lie in Kendall County, Texas.

**Article Fifteen
Notice**

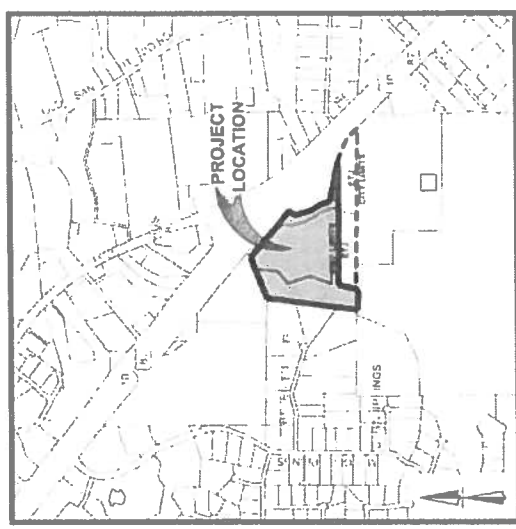

B) WHY TERRACON?

Our team of inspectors, technicians, and engineers is experienced with providing materials testing, special inspections, and/or observations of concrete, soils, aggregate, masonry, structural steel, foundations, fireproofing, and asphalt pavement in the local area and are familiar with the recognized building jurisdiction requirements.

C) SCOPE OF SERVICES

Based on our review and understanding of the documents listed above, Terracon proposes the following scope of services:

Soils Observations and Testing:

- Sample materials to be used as wall backfill and sidewalk subgrade. Prepare and test the samples for Atterberg Limits (ASTM D4318), Minus #200 Sieve (ASTM D1140), and moisture-density relationship (ASTM D698).
- Perform in-place moisture and density tests of the wall backfill and sidewalk subgrade using the nuclear method (ASTM D6938) to determine the moisture content and percent compaction of the soil materials.

Cast-in-Place Deep Foundations Observation and Testing:

- Monitor the installation of the drilled pier foundation system including verification of the depth to bearing strata, required and actual depth of penetration into the bearing strata for each pier, total depth of piers, pertinent elevations (if provided by the field engineer), plumbness of the drilled pier hole excavation, cleanliness of bearing surface at completion of drilling, etc.
- Record dimensions and the number, size and length of reinforcing bars used.
- Sample the fresh concrete and perform required tests, including slump, air content, unit weight, ambient and concrete temperature, and cast test specimens (5 cylinders per 100 cy or fraction thereof per mix per day) during placements (ASTM C172, C31, C143, C231, and C1064).
- Perform compressive tests of concrete test cylinders cast in the field (ASTM C617, C39).

Cast-in-Place Concrete Observations and Testing:

- Sample and test the fresh concrete for each mix. Perform tests for slump, air content, ambient and concrete temperatures, and unit weight; and cast test specimens (ASTM C172, C31, C143, C231, C1064, C138). Terracon understands that the contractor will be responsible for maintaining the initial field curing temperature of the concrete test specimens.
- We have assumed the concrete will be sampled at a frequency of one set of five test cylinders every 100 cubic yards or fraction thereof per mix per day for all structural concrete. Terracon requests that a copy of the approved mix design(s) be provided to us prior to placement of the concrete.
- Perform compressive strength tests of concrete test cylinders cast in the field (ASTM C31, C39). Five 4" x 8" concrete cylinders will be prepared for structural concrete having nominal maximum size aggregate of 1 inch or less. One cylinder will be tested at 7 days, three cylinders will be tested at 28 days, and one cylinder will be tested at 56 days (if the 28-day cylinders do not meet the specified strength) or at an age requested by others.

Reinforcing Steel Observations:

- Verify the size, number and placement of reinforcing steel and check general form dimensions prior to placement of concrete, per construction drawings.



Structural Steel Observations and Testing:

- Terracon recommends that the general contractor schedule a pre-erection meeting to discuss the erection sequence, review welding and bolting requirements and to review welder certification records.
- Provide a Certified Welding Inspector (CWI) in the field to visually observe accessible field bolted/welded connections in accordance with applicable AISC and AWS standards.
- Perform visual inspections of elevated metal decking for placement including overlap, fastener spacing, supports at openings and penetrations, and puddle welds pattern, size and quality.
- Terracon will observe any shear studs in association with composite concrete decks for number, pattern, and bond.
- Utilize an Ultrasonic Flaw detector to determine the quality of complete joint penetration welds such as moment connections or splice connections. If the base material has a thickness of 5/16" or greater, Terracon recommends that those welds be tested by the Ultrasonic Method in accordance with AWS D1.1.
- Perform visual inspections of 100% of completed accessible welds to verify that the welds meet the visual acceptance criteria of AWS D1.1.

Structural Masonry Observations and Testing:

- The Terracon scope of services includes visual observation of reinforcing steel placement for both vertical and horizontal bond beam reinforcing steel and observation of grout placement in vertical cells and horizontal bond beams. Materials samples should be submitted in a form that complies with applicable requirements.

Prices quoted for concrete coring are for paving and flat work. Charges for coring structural concrete can be quoted on request.

Special supplies, permits, equipment, associated drilling, sampling, field testing, on site facilities, grading contractors, water trucks, bulldozers, security forces, surveyors or other support services will be billed at cost plus 20 percent.

All rented equipment and outside services not identified in the fee schedule will be billed at cost plus 20 percent for handling.

AGREEMENT FOR SERVICES

This **AGREEMENT** is between Kendall County TX ("Client") and Terracon Consultants, Inc. ("Consultant") for Services to be provided by Consultant for Client on the Kendall County Materials Testing Services project ("Project"); as described in Consultant's Proposal dated 08/03/2022 ("Proposal"), including but not limited to the Project Information section, unless the Project is otherwise described in Exhibit A to this Agreement (which section or Exhibit is incorporated into this Agreement).

- 1. Scope of Services.** The scope of Consultant's services is described in the Proposal, including but not limited to the Scope of Services section ("Services"), unless Services are otherwise described in Exhibit B to this Agreement (which section or exhibit is incorporated into this Agreement). Portions of the Services may be subcontracted. When Consultant subcontracts to other individuals or companies, then consultant will collect from Client on the Subcontractors' behalf. Consultant's Services do not include the investigation or detection of, nor do recommendations in Consultant's reports address the presence or prevention of biological pollutants (e.g., mold, fungi, bacteria, viruses, or their byproducts) or occupant safety issues, such as vulnerability to natural disasters, terrorism, or violence. If Services include purchase of software, Client will execute a separate software license agreement. Consultant's findings, opinions, and recommendations are based solely upon data and information obtained by and furnished to Consultant at the time of the Services.
- 2. Acceptance/ Termination.** Client agrees that execution of this Agreement is a material element of the consideration Consultant requires to execute the Services, and if Services are initiated by Consultant prior to execution of this Agreement as an accommodation for Client at Client's request, both parties shall consider that commencement of Services constitutes formal acceptance of all terms and conditions of this Agreement. Additional terms and conditions may be added or changed only by written amendment to this Agreement signed by both parties. In the event Client uses a purchase order or other form to administer this Agreement, the use of such form shall be for convenience purposes only and any additional or conflicting terms it contains are stricken. This Agreement shall not be assigned by either party without prior written consent of the other party. Either party may terminate this Agreement or the Services upon written notice to the other. In such case, Consultant shall be paid costs incurred and fees earned to the date of termination plus reasonable costs of closing the Project.
- 3. Change Orders.** Client may request changes to the scope of Services by altering or adding to the Services to be performed. If Client so requests, Consultant will return to Client a statement (or supplemental proposal) of the change setting forth an adjustment to the Services and fees for the requested changes. Following Client's review, Client shall provide written acceptance. If Client does not follow these procedures, but instead directs, authorizes, or permits Consultant to perform changed or additional work, the Services are changed accordingly and Consultant will be paid for this work according to the fees stated or its current fee schedule. If project conditions change materially from those observed at the site or described to Consultant at the time of proposal, Consultant is entitled to a change order equitably adjusting its Services and fee.
- 4. Compensation and Terms of Payment.** Client shall pay compensation for the Services performed at the fees stated in the Proposal, including but not limited to the Compensation section, unless fees are otherwise stated in Exhibit C to this Agreement (which section or Exhibit is incorporated into this Agreement). If not stated in either, fees will be according to Consultant's current fee schedule. Fee schedules are valid for the calendar year in which they are issued. Fees do not include sales tax. Client will pay applicable sales tax as required by law. Consultant may invoice Client at least monthly and payment is due upon receipt of invoice. Client shall notify Consultant in writing, at the address below, within 15 days of the date of the invoice if Client objects to any portion of the charges on the invoice, and shall promptly pay the undisputed portion. Client shall pay a finance fee of 1.5% per month, but not exceeding the maximum rate allowed by law, for all unpaid amounts 30 days or older. Client agrees to pay all collection-related costs that Consultant incurs, including attorney fees. Consultant may suspend Services for lack of timely payment. It is the responsibility of Client to determine whether federal, state, or local prevailing wage requirements apply and to notify Consultant if prevailing wages apply. If it is later determined that prevailing wages apply, and Consultant was not previously notified by Client, Client agrees to pay the prevailing wage from that point forward, as well as a retroactive payment adjustment to bring previously paid amounts in line with prevailing wages. Client also agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless Consultant from any alleged violations made by any governmental agency regulating prevailing wage activity for failing to pay prevailing wages, including the payment of any fines or penalties.
- 5. Third Party Reliance.** This Agreement and the Services provided are for Consultant and Client's sole benefit and exclusive use with no third party beneficiaries intended. Reliance upon the Services and any work product is limited to Client, and is not intended for third parties other than those who have executed Consultant's reliance agreement, subject to the prior approval of Consultant and Client.
- 6. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY.** CLIENT AND CONSULTANT HAVE EVALUATED THE RISKS AND REWARDS ASSOCIATED WITH THIS PROJECT, INCLUDING CONSULTANT'S FEE RELATIVE TO THE RISKS ASSUMED, AND AGREE TO ALLOCATE CERTAIN OF THE ASSOCIATED RISKS. TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, THE TOTAL AGGREGATE LIABILITY OF CONSULTANT (AND ITS RELATED CORPORATIONS AND EMPLOYEES) TO CLIENT AND THIRD PARTIES GRANTED RELIANCE IS LIMITED TO THE GREATER OF \$10,000 OR CONSULTANT'S FEE, FOR ANY AND ALL INJURIES, DAMAGES, CLAIMS, LOSSES, OR EXPENSES (INCLUDING ATTORNEY AND EXPERT FEES) ARISING OUT OF CONSULTANT'S SERVICES OR THIS AGREEMENT. PRIOR TO ACCEPTANCE OF THIS AGREEMENT AND UPON WRITTEN REQUEST FROM CLIENT, CONSULTANT MAY NEGOTIATE A HIGHER LIMITATION FOR ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATION IN THE FORM OF A SURCHARGE TO BE ADDED TO THE AMOUNT STATED IN THE COMPENSATION SECTION OF THE PROPOSAL. THIS LIMITATION SHALL APPLY REGARDLESS OF AVAILABLE PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE COVERAGE, CAUSE(S), OR THE THEORY OF LIABILITY, INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE, INDEMNITY, OR OTHER RECOVERY. THIS LIMITATION SHALL NOT APPLY TO THE EXTENT THE DAMAGE IS PAID UNDER CONSULTANT'S COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY POLICY.
- 7. Indemnity/Statute of Limitations.** Consultant and Client shall indemnify and hold harmless the other and their respective employees from and against legal liability for claims, losses, damages, and expenses to the extent such claims, losses, damages, or expenses are legally determined to be caused by their negligent acts, errors, or omissions. In the event such claims, losses, damages, or expenses are legally determined to be caused by the joint or concurrent negligence of Consultant and Client, they shall be borne by each party in proportion to its own negligence under comparative fault principles. Neither party shall have a duty to defend the other party, and no duty to defend is hereby created by this indemnity provision and such duty is explicitly waived under this Agreement. Causes of action arising out of Consultant's Services or this Agreement regardless of cause(s) or the theory of liability, including negligence, indemnity or other recovery shall be deemed to have accrued and the applicable statute of limitations shall commence to run not later than the date of Consultant's substantial completion of Services on the project.
- 8. Warranty.** Consultant will perform the Services in a manner consistent with that level of care and skill ordinarily exercised by members of the profession currently practicing under similar conditions in the same locale. EXCEPT FOR THE STANDARD OF CARE PREVIOUSLY STATED, CONSULTANT MAKES NO WARRANTIES OR GUARANTEES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, RELATING TO CONSULTANT'S SERVICES AND CONSULTANT DISCLAIMS ANY IMPLIED WARRANTIES OR WARRANTIES IMPOSED BY LAW, INCLUDING WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY AND FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE.
- 9. Insurance.** Consultant represents that it now carries, and will continue to carry: (i) workers' compensation insurance in accordance with the laws of the states having jurisdiction over Consultant's employees who are engaged in the Services, and employer's liability insurance (\$1,000,000); (ii) commercial general liability insurance (\$2,000,000 occ / \$4,000,000 agg); (iii) automobile liability insurance (\$2,000,000 B.I. and P.D. combined single

limit); and (iv) professional liability insurance (\$1,000,000 claim / agg). Certificates of insurance will be provided upon request. Client and Consultant shall waive subrogation against the other party on all general liability and property coverage.

Client shall provide this opinion to Consultant and the parties shall endeavor to resolve the dispute within 30 days, after which Client may pursue its remedies at law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed according to Kansas law.

12. Subsurface Explorations. Subsurface conditions throughout the site may vary from those depicted on logs of discrete borings, test pits, or other exploratory services. Client understands Consultant's layout of boring and test locations is approximate and that Consultant may deviate a reasonable distance from those locations. No claims for loss or damage or injury shall be brought against Consultant by Client or any third party unless all tests and inspections have been so performed and Consultant's recommendations have been followed. Unless otherwise stated in the Proposal, Client assumes sole responsibility for determining whether the quantity and the nature of Services ordered by Client is adequate and sufficient for Client's intended purpose. Client is responsible (even if delegated to contractor) for requesting services, and notifying and scheduling Consultant so Consultant can perform these Services. Consultant is not responsible for damages caused by Services not performed due to a failure to request or schedule Consultant's Services. Consultant shall not be responsible for the quality and completeness of Client's contractor's work or their adherence to the project documents, and Consultant's performance of testing and observation services shall not relieve Client's contractor in any way from its responsibility for defects discovered in its work, or create a warranty or guarantee. Consultant will not supervise or direct the work performed by Client's contractor or its subcontractors and is not responsible for their means and methods. The extension of unit prices with quantities to establish a total estimated cost does not guarantee a maximum cost to complete the Services. The quantities, when given, are estimates based on contract documents and schedules made available at the time of the Proposal. Since schedule, performance, production, and charges are directed and/or controlled by others, any quantity extensions must be considered as estimated and not a guarantee of maximum cost.


14. Sample Disposition, Affected Materials, and Indemnity. Samples are consumed in testing or disposed of upon completion of the testing procedures (unless stated otherwise in the Services). Client shall furnish or cause to be furnished to Consultant all documents and information known or available to Client that relate to the identity, location, quantity, nature, or characteristic of any hazardous waste, toxic, radioactive, or contaminated materials ("Affected Materials") at or near the site, and shall immediately transmit new, updated, or revised information as it becomes available. Client agrees that Consultant is not responsible for the disposition of Affected Materials unless specifically provided in the Services, and that Client is responsible for directing such disposition. In no event shall Consultant be required to sign a hazardous waste manifest or take title to any Affected Materials. Client shall have the obligation to make all spill or release notifications to appropriate governmental agencies. The Client agrees that Consultant neither created nor contributed to the creation or existence of any Affected Materials conditions at the site and Consultant shall not be responsible for any claims, losses, or damages allegedly arising out of Consultant's performance of Services hereunder, or for any claims against Consultant as a generator, disposer, or arranger of Affected Materials under federal, state, or local law or ordinance.

15. Ownership of Documents. Work product, such as reports, logs, data, notes, or calculations, prepared by Consultant shall remain Consultant's property. Proprietary concepts, systems, and ideas developed during performance of the Services shall remain the sole property of Consultant. Files shall be maintained in general accordance with Consultant's document retention policies and practices.

16. Utilities. Unless otherwise stated in the Proposal, Client shall provide the location and/or arrange for the marking of private utilities and subterranean structures. Consultant shall take reasonable precautions to avoid damage or injury to subterranean structures or utilities. Consultant shall not be responsible for damage to subterranean structures or utilities that are not called to Consultant's attention, are not correctly marked, including by a utility locate service, or are incorrectly shown on the plans furnished to Consultant.

17. Site Access and Safety. Client shall secure all necessary site related approvals, permits, licenses, and consents necessary to commence and complete the Services and will execute any necessary site access agreement. Consultant will be responsible for supervision and site safety measures for its own employees, but shall not be responsible for the supervision or health and safety precautions for any other parties, including Client, Client's contractors, subcontractors, or other parties present at the site. In addition, Consultant retains the right to stop work without penalty at any time Consultant believes it is in the best interests of Consultant's employees or subcontractors to do so in order to reduce the risk of exposure to the coronavirus. Client agrees it will respond quickly to all requests for information made by Consultant related to Consultant's pre-task planning and risk assessment processes. Client acknowledges its responsibility for notifying Consultant of any circumstances that present a risk of exposure to the coronavirus or individuals who have tested positive for COVID-19 or are self-quarantining due to exhibiting symptoms associated with the coronavirus.

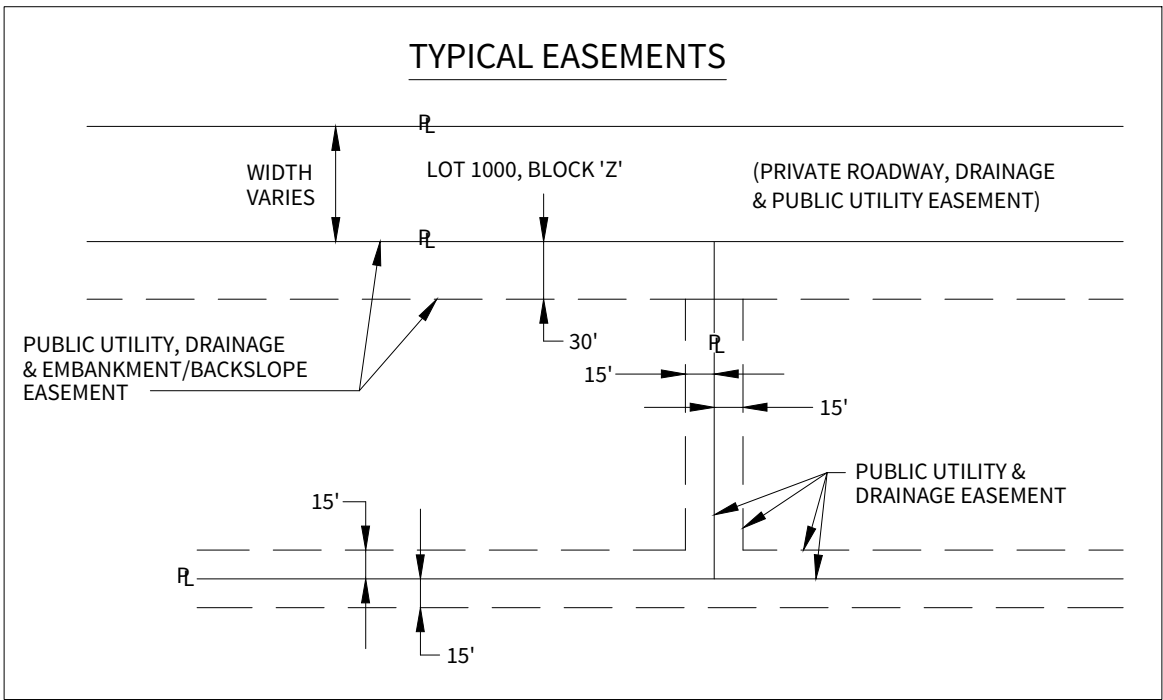

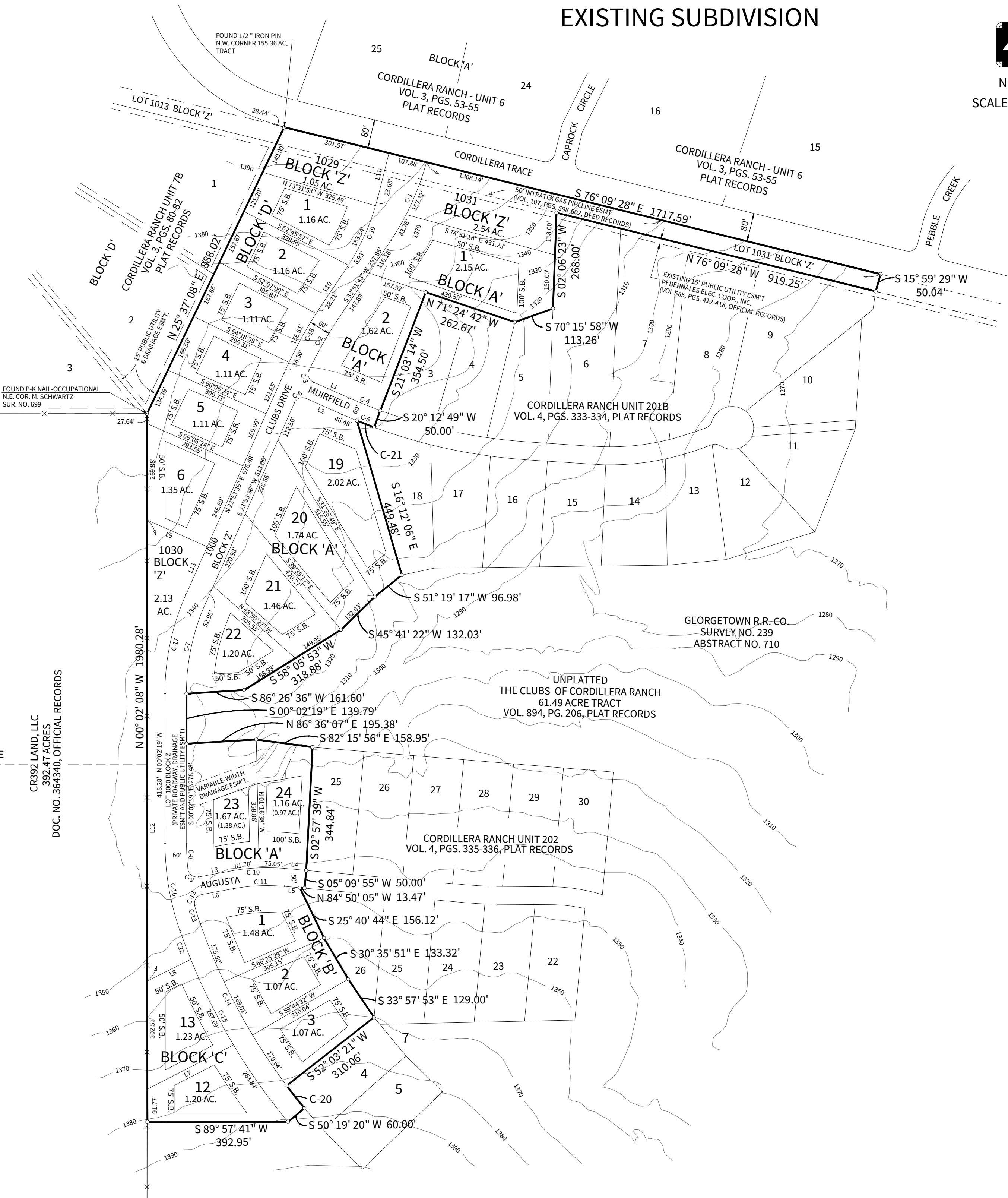
