ORDER RECOGINZING CERTAIN PREVIOUSLY APPROVED PLATS

WHEREAS, THE Commissioners Court of Kendall County must approve, by an order entered in the minutes of the court, a plat required by Tex. Loc. Gov't Code Ann §§ 232.001 et seq, as amended; and

WHEREAS, in the past, deeds, subdivisions of property, and other instruments affecting property were approved by Commissioners Court that were incorrectly approved and recorded in the Kendall County Clerk's Office resulting in incorrect or inaccurate information being reflected in the County's official public records; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court has the authority to delegate plat approval responsibility as provided by Tex. Loc. Gov't Code Ann § 232.0022; and

WHEREAS, amending plats or plat revisions have been prepared for property within the Town of Comfort and within WCID 1 and previously filed in the County Clerk's Office; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court desires to provide an expedited process for approval of plat corrections or plat amendments which merely reflect such existing situations in order to ensure that County records correctly indicate existing situations and to save the citizens of Kendall County unnecessary delay and expense; and

WHEREAS, in areas within Water Control and Improvement District Number 1 ("WCID 1") may be served by Central Water and Central Sewer; and

WHEREAS, amending plats or plat revisions have been prepared for property within the Town of Comfort and within WCID 1 and previously filed in the County Clerk's records; and

WHEREAS, these plats were incorrectly processed as amending plats or plat revisions when a new plat should have been submitted.

NOW THEREFORE, the following Order is adopted, effective immediately, concerning existing situations where deeds, subdivisions of property, and other instruments affecting property were recorded in the Kendall County Clerk's Office:

- 1. In areas served by WCID 1, the Kendall County Engineer is delegated the authority to file a document and/or instrument in the County Clerk's records correcting any previously approved plat to accurately reflect the plat as a "Final Plat" rather than "Amending Plat," or "Plat Revision".
- 2. The County Engineer shall certify that the previously approved plat was improperly named and record an affidavit referencing this Order with the Plat in the County Clerk's records.
